- *Neighborhood Services* Serve, foster, and strengthen community by providing access to lifelong learning and opportunities to enjoy life.
- *Transportation & Aviation Services* A safe and efficient transportation system that contributes to the livability and economic health of the City; and provide for the air transportation needs of the community and the region at levels that is acceptable to the community.
- *Environment and Utility Services* Manage environmental services and utility systems to ensure a sustainable environment for the community.
- *Public Safety Services* Commitment to excellence in public safety by investing in neighborhood partnerships as well as prevention, enforcement, and emergency preparedness services.

You may speak to the City Council about any discussion item that is on the agenda, and you may also speak during Open Forum on items that are not on the agenda and are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the City Council or Redevelopment Agency Board. If you wish to speak to the City Council, please refer to the following guidelines:

- o Fill out a Yellow Speaker's Card and submit it to the City Clerk seated at the front table. Do this before the meeting or before the item is heard. This will ensure that your name is called for the item(s) that you wish to address, and it will help ensure the meeting runs smoothly for all participants.
- o When the Council reaches your item on the agenda, Mayor Reed will open the public hearing and call your name. Please address the Council from the podium, which is located to the left of the City Clerk's table.
- o Each speaker generally has two minutes to speak per item. The amount of time allotted to speakers may vary at the Mayor's discretion, depending on the number of speakers or the length of the agenda.
- O To assist you in tracking your speaking time, there is a display on the podium. The green light turns on when you begin speaking; the yellow light turns on when you have 30 seconds left; and the red light turns on when your speaking time is up.

Please be advised that, by law, the City Council is unable to discuss or take action on issues presented during Open Forum. According to State Law (the Brown Act) items must first be noticed on the agenda before any discussion or action.

The San José City Council meets every Tuesday at 1:30 p.m. and Tuesday at 7 p.m. as needed, unless otherwise noted. 4.1 Downtown Commercial High-Rise Development Incentives.

Recommendation: As recommended by the Community and Economic Development Committee on September 22, 2014, direct the City Attorney to draft an ordinance amending Chapter 4.46 of Title of the San José Municipal Code and Chapter 4.47 of Title 4 of the San José Municipal Code to add sections to suspend the collection of the building and structure constructions tax for a single commercial high rise development project within two years. Staff recommendations were accepted with direction to staff to provide an analysis on requirements for pursuing local preferences for contractors, to moving ahead on pursuing local preferences, and with staff to return to Council in late January or early February for final action.

4.2 Actions Related to the Downtown Residential High-Rise and Mid-Rise Park Fee Incentive Program.

Recommendation:

- (a) Per Council Direction from June 17, 2014, direct the City Attorney to draft a resolution to establish a new Downtown High-Rise and Mid-Rise Park Fee Incentive program to allow high-rise developers to pay 50% of their parkland inlieu fees at certificate of occupancy, and to make a payment equivalent to the remaining 50% of the fee over a 5 year period; and allow mid-rise developers to pay 75% of their fee at certificate of occupancy and to make a payment equivalent to the remaining 25% of the fees over a 5 year period, with the latter payments to be set aside in a fund for downtown parks operations and maintenance;
- (b) Provide policy direction to staff for the next step to be taken in the development of a potential downtown parks district.

Simoni for the use of approximately 8,500 square feet of office space in San José, at a rental rate of \$156,000 for the first year, \$160,200 for the second year, \$164,400 for the third year, \$168,600 for the fourth year, and \$172,800 for the fifth year. The total rental cost for the five-year term of this lease is \$822,000. The lease agreement begins on September 1, 2014 and ends on August 31, 2019. CEQA: Not a Project, File No. PP10-066(f), Lease of existing space. (Economic Development)

The Mayor's Gang Prevention Task Force Strategic Work Plan 2015 – 2017 was accepted, with changes as outlined in Mayor Reed's memorandum of December 1, 2014 and with recommendations as suggested by Councilmember Rocha to modify the chart depicting Funding and Homicides (Page 13) with a chart measuring at least a decade of statistics including a retrospective funding analysis covering gang-related incidents and violent gang crimes.

6.1 Downtown Sidewalks Bicycle Riding.

Recommendation:

- (a) Approve an ordinance to prohibit the riding of bicycles on sidewalks in designated areas of Downtown San José, with exceptions for police officers and persons 12 years of age or under, and amending Section 1.08.020 of Chapter 1.08 of Title 1 to Designate a Violation of Section 11.72.190 as an Infraction.
- (b) (Option 1) Define the designated area as:
 - (1) Santa Clara Street between Stockton Avenue and Eleventh Street.
 - (2) San Fernando Street between Cahill Street and Eleventh Street.
 - (3) First Street between St. John Street and San Carlos Street.
 - (4) Second Street between St. John Street and San Carlos Street.
 - (5) Third Street between St. John Street and San Carlos Street.
 - (6) Fourth Street between St. John Street and San Carlos Street.

6.1 Downtown Sidewalks Bicycle Riding.

(c) (Option 2) Alternatively, the City Council could define the designated area as, consistent with the Downtown Skateboard Prohibition Zone: Beginning at the intersection of Julian Street and Fourth Street and then going west on Julian Street to San Pedro Street, then going south on San Pedro Street to Santa Clara Street, then going west on Santa Clara Street to Route 87, then going south along Route 87 to Woz Way, then going south along Woz Way to Balbach Street, then going east on Balbach Street to Almaden Boulevard, then going north on Almaden Boulevard to Viola Avenue, then going east on Viola Avenue to Market Street, then going south on Market Street to Reed Street, then going east on Reed Street to Second Street, then going north on Second Street to San Carlos Street, then going east on San Carlos Street to Fourth Street, then going north on Fourth Street to Julian Street.

Ordinance No. 29515 passed for publication, adopting Option 1 of the staff recommendation with changes to exclude Santa Clara Street between Stockton Avenue and Eleventh Street due to obstruction from Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) construction; to exempt cyclists 12 years or under and those transporting someone who is 12 years or under; and with staff to return to the Transportation and Environment Committee with an update on the implementation of a behavioral rules and an education campaign, more clearly defining reckless behavior, to be included with the Department of Transportation's annual report due in the March/April 2015 timeframe.

7. ENVIRONMENTAL & UTILITY SERVICES

7.1 Approval of Proposed Odor Control Strategy at the San José-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility.
