City Manager Debra Figone thanked those who worked to bring Virgin America Airlines to the San José International Airport, and welcomed Sophie Kijas who is visiting San José from Australia as part of an international professional development exchange program.

COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

4.1 Approve the report on bids and award of a construction contract for 4628 - Commodore Park to the low bidder, Suarez & Munoz Construction, Inc., in the amount of \$2,057,000, and approve a seven and one-half percent contingency in the amount of \$154,275. CEQA: Mitigated Negative Declaration, File No. PP03-04-134. Council District 4. (Public Works)

- 7.1 Conduct a public hearing on the applications of the following companies for Commercial Solid Waste and Recyclables Collection Franchises for the non-exclusive collection and transport of residential clean-out material and construction and demolition debris; approve the ordinances granting the franchises; and approve the Commercial Solid Waste and Recyclables Collection Franchise Agreements for the non-exclusive collection and transport of Residential Clean-Out Material and Construction and Demolition Debris for a term from April 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014 with the option of three one-year extensions:
 - (a) Thinh Truong dba AWR Dumpsters; and
 - (b) Bernardini Enterprises, Inc. dba Chip It Recycling.

CEQA: Exempt; File No. PP08-228. (Environmental Services)

Mayor Reed opened the public hearing.

<u>Public Comment</u>: Jim Piazzo expressed environmental concerns and complained that there are multiple sets of rules for the various companies involved.

Mayor Reed closed the public hearing.

Action: Upon motion by Council Member Liccardo, seconded by Vice Mayor Nguyen, and carried unanimously, Ordinance No. 29206, entitled: "An Ordinance of the City of San José Granting a Commercial Solid Waste and Recyclables Collection Franchise to Thinh Truong DBA AWR Dumpsters"; and Ordinance No. 29207, entitled: "An Ordinance of the City of San José Granting a Commercial Solid Waste and Recyclables Collection Franchise to Bernardini Enterprises, Inc. DBA Chip It Recycling", were passed for publication. (10-0-1. Absent: Herrera.)

PUBLIC SAFETY SERVICES

8.1 As recommended by the Public Safety, Finance and Strategic Support Committee on January 24, 2013, accept the report related to the impact of cardroom gambling on crime in the City of San José for the period July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2012. (Police)

<u>Documents Filed</u>: Memorandum from Acting City Clerk Toni Taber, dated January 29, 2013, transmitting the recommendations of the Public Safety, Finance and Strategic Support Committee.

Sergeant David Fong, Division of Gaming Control, responded to questions from Council. Council discussion followed.

<u>Motion</u>: Council Member Constant moved approval of the report, with direction to staff to work towards a more well-defined report for next year. The motion was seconded by Vice Mayor Nguyen.

Council discussion continued with direction to staff as outlined below in "Action".

Action: On a call for the question, the motion carried unanimously, and the report related to the impact of cardroom gambling on crime in the City of San José for the period of July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2012, was accepted, with Staff directed to narrow the focus to allow for greater relevance on next year's report. (10-0-1. Absent: Herrera.)

Forrest Williams urged the City leaders to work towards the elimination of graffiti from the City of San José.
