In November 2015, the City Council directed staff to study the feasibility of the potential formation of a special financing district and/or other sustainable funding mechanisms for operations, maintenance and capital repairs of Downtown parks, as well as for all parks within the City of San José. This direction is now City Council Policy Priority #5 (Downtown and/or Citywide Parks Operations and Maintenance Financing District).

In 2017, the Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services Department partnered with the Trust for Public Lands, which issued a <u>Park Finance Feasibility Study</u> in July 2017 identifying several options, including a parcel tax.

In summer 2017 and spring 2018, the City's contracted survey research consultant conducted public opinion polling for a potential parcel tax ballot measure similar in structure to the Los Angeles County Safe, Clean Neighborhood Parks and Beaches Measure of 2016. The polling showed a majority of voters support a variety of parks and recreation programs, but support for new funding fell several percentage points short of the two-thirds requirement for a specific tax.

Staff will provide the Parks and Recreation Commission with background information on past work and a brief update on the status of work currently underway.
