VII. Call to Order & Orders of the Day

The Human Services Commission of the City of San José convened for their regular meeting at 6:30 p.m. in Tower Conference Room 1753 at City Hall.

Present Commissioners: Dickinson Goodman, Carvallison, Knight, Estrada, Lopez, Maciel, Demers.

Absent Commissioners: Elieh, Barocio, and Dotson.

II. Consent Calendar

A. Approve the minutes for December 20, 2018.

Action: Upon a motion by Commissioner Estrada, seconded by Commissioner Lopez and carried unanimously, the Commission voted to remove the minutes from the Consent Calendar.

V. Reports and Information Only

- A. Chair Dickinson Goodman spoke about the need for filling the empty seats on the Commission, asked all Commissioners to help with that, and thanked them for their patience in dealing with the texts and emails regarding quorum.
- B. Commission Council Liaison Carrasco spoke about her pleasure in being appointed as the new Commission liaison, her own work related to the topics of the Commission's work plan, introduced her staffer Kiara Arreola, and the importance of the work of this Commission.
- C. Sabrina Parra-Garcia, Executive Analyst, City Manager's Office, provided an oral report that the City Attorney's Office response to the updated Women's Bill of Right's rewritten language is in process.

B. Women's Bill of Rights Request for Information (RFI); Chair Dickinson Goodman and staff

Chair Dickinson Goodman presented the sample Response for Information (RFI) for a gender equity analysis.

- Blair Beekman, resident, spoke in support of doing an RFI and a Request for Proposals for the gender equity analysis, particularly explicitly including non-binary people in both.

Action: With a motion by Commission Lopez, seconded by Commissioner Demers, the Commission voted unanimously to approve the RFI for release to the public.
