SUBJECT: PUBLIC ART ADVISORY COMMITTEE APPOINTMENT

RECOMMENDATION

Take action on the Public Art Committee recommendation for the Arts Commission to approve the following appointment to the Public Art Advisory Committee:

- 1) Appoint Jessica Schaefer to a full term ending June 30, 2020.

BACKGROUND

On January 12, 2000, the Arts Commission approved the formation of a Public Art Advisory Committee (PAAC) to include four art and design professionals and a non-specific number of special constituent ("guest") members for specific projects or programs. *Public Art NEXT!*, the public art master plan, adopted in 2007, further clarifies the PAAC as a five-member, non-voting adjunct committee of the Public Art Committee (PAC) comprised of professionals in the fields of art, design, architecture, landscape architecture, and urban planning. The PAAC convenes as part of the regularly scheduled PAC meeting and evaluates aesthetic issues related to art projects and makes recommendations to the PAC prior to votes on agenda items.

Staff develops a list of recommended PAAC candidates for review with the PAC, which then takes action to forward the recommendations for PAAC appointments to the Arts Commission for approval.

PAAC appointees serve renewable, two-year terms. From time to time, guest members that can provide expertise in conjunction with a specific project or program may be appointed to the PAAC and serve for a limited period determined by the PAC.

On February 27, 2017 the Arts Commission appointed Chloe Verrey for a partial term ending June 30, 2018, to fill a seat that was vacated by her SJDA predecessor Eric Hon when he took a position with the City of San Jose. The Arts Commission also reappointed Barbara Horiuchi to serve a term ending June 30, 2019. On April 16, 2018 the Arts Commission reappointed Chloe Verrey to another full term ending June 30, 2020 and appointed Karen Gauss to a to a full term ending June 30, 2020.

ANALYSIS

The proposed appointment is for Jessica Schaefer to be appointed for a full two-year term ending June 30, 2020.

Jessica Shaefer is the Global Art Program Manager at Facebook, where she works with teams from the Artists in Residence Program (FB AIR), the Analog Research Laboratory, and international curators on strategic planning, community engagement, internal and external partnerships, and other arts- and culture-related programming initiatives across Facebook campuses globally. She was previously the Project Director of Sites Unseen, a public art initiative that activates alleyways in downtown San Francisco with permanent installations and temporary projects. She is also the co-founder of Mixed Use, a nomadic curatorial collective that presents exhibitions and events featuring artist-chef collaborations, and the President of the Board of Directors of The Lab, a nonprofit experimental arts incubator in San Francisco. Jessica moved to the Bay Area four years ago from New York City, where she ran a contemporary art gallery and was later Communications Director at Creative Time, the renowned public art nonprofit organization. Jessica graduated from Wesleyan University in Connecticut with a honors degree in the College of Letters, a multidisciplinary program focused on the study of philosophy, history, and foreign languages. Because of the Public Art program's interest and need to collaborate with leading technology companies such as Facebook, and to harness the ability to collaborate with such companies, Ms. Shaefer will be an excellent and needed appointment to the PAAC.

Support of this recommendation will leave on possible vacancy on the PAAC.
