RECOMMENDATION

That the following recommendation be enacted.

Proposal

Program/Project Title:

Reinstate one Park Ranger based out of Lake Almaden and focused on citywide trail patrol

Amount of City Funding Required: \$104,926

Fund Type (i.e. General Fund, C&C funds, etc.) General Fund

Anticipated Outcomes: Requested funding changes would affect benefits or services for San José residents, businesses, community groups, etc., as described below: (Use as much space as required.)

The new model for the Park Ranger Program is based upon Dynamic Deployment. The proposed base locations for the 4 remaining Park Rangers are Alum Rock and Kelley Parks. Basing Park Rangers in these locations leaves South San Jose vulnerable. In addition, a known swimming location should have a minimum level of supervision.

Concern regarding safety on our trails is citywide. Attached are copies of a letter from Guadalupe River Park Conservancy, Legacy Partners and the news article about the fatal accident on Los Alamitos Creek Trail. In a perfect world, our trails would be well and actively patrolled by Park Rangers who serve as law enforcement officers from dawn to dusk, seven days a week. We must provide more pro-active service to these isolated areas than has been proposed by staff. We cannot ignore the fact that our trails were once unpopular due to the numerous homeless encampments. Currently, our trail system has positive public reputation. However, regular trail users are expressing their concerns that the trails are becoming unsafe and unsettling. If the current reputation is tarnished, it will take years to undo any bad publicity. Providing a Park Ranger who will focus on our city trails will enhance trail safety and will prevent smaller issues from becoming larger ones.
