





SJPA adheres to Americans for the Arts' best practices which states:

**WHY WOULD A PROGRAM MAKE A NATIONAL CALL FOR ARTISTS INSTEAD OF A LOCAL CALL? WHAT ARE THE REASONS FOR EXPANDING (OR RESTRICTING) CALLS TO SPECIFIC GEOGRAPHICAL REGIONS?**

Calls for Artists are typically open to all artists to allow the widest inclusion of experienced and qualified professionals to create artwork. Sometimes a public art program may geographically restrict the Call, limiting eligibility to artists from the city, county, or state. Occasionally, those restrictions are made to ensure the funding benefits artists from a particular region. There is also precedent for programs instituting geographic and experience-based restrictions for low budget projects, which helps emerging artists obtain their first commission and thus improves their ability to compete for projects nationally.

However, geographically restricting Calls can result in other programs doing the same, which has the less favorable effect of reducing competition and excellence across commissions. So, ideally, public art programs should open their Calls to a national talent pool unless there are compelling reasons for restricting it.

Americans for the Arts is a nonprofit organization whose primary focus is advancing the arts in the United States. With more than 50 years of service, the organization has established best practices via national research from its broad network of artists and administrators. Their recommendation to not restrict calls for artists locally is implemented widely by the vast majority of the 700 government agencies that have percent for art programs.

While adhering to best practices, SJPA strives to ensure local artists are equipped to compete locally against, regionally, nationally, or internationally recognized artists, and are given the opportunities to do so. The SJPA has a reputation for fairness in the procurement process. As part of this, the artist selection process employs diverse local neighborhood review panels (also referred to as Public Art Core Teams) which are organized in conjunction with council offices to help with artist selection. After a formal Request for Qualifications (RFQ) or Request for Proposals (RFP) has been released, and applicants received, these neighborhood review panels select the most qualified artist based on their portfolio, resume, and statement of interest. Categories which are analyzed by the local neighborhood review panel during this review process are: artistic quality, project management, and community integration. This review process has remained relatively unchanged in the history of the program, and local neighborhood review panels tend to select the artist most qualified whose skillset is of interest to them and the project. The artist that is most qualified knows no geographic distinction, there are talented artists everywhere, and the community tends to not select an artist based on where they are from, but rather the quality of their art. Regardless, this analysis proves that during the history of the public art program, there is a great density of artistic quality that exists within the Bay Area, and that is reflected in the data in Attachment A.

To summarize, during the 35-year history of SJPA the number of contracts that have gone to local versus non-local artists is roughly split. With 47% or \$11,361,182 going to local, and \$13,176,332 going to non-local artists.



## **Technical Assistance and Professional Development Support**

To fulfill a demand for education not available to local artists through higher education, SJPA has a history of providing technical assistance opportunities. In 1994, SJPA began a series of workshops, focused on Santa Clara County artists, to assist studio artists in the development of skills required to work as artists in the public art field. The workshops focused on the “front end” of the public art process up to the point of fabrication. They also concentrated on public sector commissions, with information about the private and corporate sectors as well. The workshops were intended for artists with little or no previous public commission experience. In 1994, the workshop was a full day. In 1996, the workshop was hosted over a period of seven to twelve weeks. The original workshops, hosted in 1994 and 1996 included workshops and seminars led by experienced professionals in the field of public art. From these workshops, locally focused projects were realized, some of which in conjunction with SJSU faculty and students.

In 2009 and 2010, the Northern California Public Art Administrators network offered the Public Art Academy. SJPA was a primary organizer of this academy as staffing and funding levels provided administrative capacity to do so. (There were nine full time public art staff.) This educational opportunity was provided to help local artists living or working in the counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, San Francisco, Santa Clara, and Santa Cruz to develop tools for gaining and successfully fulfilling public art commissions. The Academy schedule was for six consecutive Saturdays, and workshops were held all day long covering the topics of: Transition from Studio Artist to Public Artist; Applying for a Public Art Project; Concept Development; Schematic Design; Design Development/Construction Documents; Contracts and other Legalities. Over 60 Bay Area artists graduated from this academy, many of whom have gone onto great success in the public art field.

Since 2017, SJPA has led educational outreach efforts by conducting workshops and lectures at local universities, colleges, and arts organizations. One such series of outreach efforts helped to educate and inform students regarding the Census Poster contest, an entry level public art project designed to engage new artists in the public art design process, another included a hands-on RFQ review process with SJSU fine art students, and another included a discussion at Local Color about the public art process.

In an effort to further help local artists, SJPA released a RFQ in 2017 to create a local pre-qualified mural artist roster for upcoming mural projects within the City of San José. The call was geographically restricted, and all artists were either local or from the Bay Area. One-hundred and twenty-six (126) artists submitted applications. The Artist Selection review panel selected 75 artists to include on the pre-qualified artist roster. Fifteen contracts have been executed with local artists using this roster for mural projects comprising a total of \$300,500 in contracts. SJPA has also worked with local organizations such as Curatus (responsible for ArtboxSJ), Local Color, and Empire Seven (POW! WOW! San Jose) to help realize many of their projects funded through City grants, BeautifySJ grants, and direct commissions such as the 3<sup>rd</sup> Street Parking Garage Mural project. However, these efforts were excluded in the attached report. Also excluded from this analysis is the significant amount of grant funding provided by the OCA that goes directly to local arts organizations.



### **Additional Support of Local Artists through the San Jose Office of Cultural Affairs**

Recognizing that the field of public art is only one of many artistic disciplines, in addition to opportunities provided through SJPA, local artists practicing in multiple disciplines have the opportunity to participate in other OCA programs and services.

Among them include:

- Cultural Funding Program: A portfolio of six grant programs, totaling a FY 19-20 investment of \$5.5 M in the local ecosystem, which in large part invests in organizations and projects that support and employ local artists. (OCA is the largest funder of the arts in the South Bay.)
- The Creative Entrepreneur Program consists of grant opportunities called the Creative Capacity Fund and Creative Industries Incentive Fund. Over the last eight rounds of funding for the Creative Industries Incentive Fund, a total of 70 grants in the amount of \$330,000 have supported San Jose creative entrepreneurs of all disciplines with a majority serving creative entrepreneurs of color. Through this program, the OCA presents career development training and resources such as fundraising and marketing workshops.
- City Hall Exhibits offer exhibition opportunities for local artists. For example, in the City Hall Lobby there is a current exhibition featuring the work of local glassblowers through a collaboration with the Bay Area Glass Institute. Another example is the 2019 Chop Sticks Alley exhibit that featured the work of local Vietnamese-American visual artists.
- Other specific ways in that the City is working with artists include our investments in marketing such as Content magazine, Live and Local campaign (local live music), Creative Ambassador fellowships, Make Music Day, below market leases to City-owned exhibition spaces like Works, hiring artists for local performances and graphic design jobs, technical assistance, and specific commissions, like the creation of the annual Cornerstone Award, which is bestowed to art leaders, many of whom are artists, and their projects at the annual Cornerstone of the Arts event.
- The City is advancing an affordable housing project in the downtown that will target artists and cultural workers with the goal that artists can afford to live here and contribute to the community.
- As part of the June 21<sup>st</sup> Make Music Day, the OCA's Creative Expression Ambassador Barbara Day Turner and the SJ Chamber Orchestra performed 30 songs submitted by local artists that were inspired by San Jose. OCA paid Barbara for this project, which was called the "My San Jose Song Project."
- *Sonic Runway* will be enhanced and serve as a performance venue for ongoing events and activations, in which local artists will be invited to perform the runway. During its initial four-month installation, the OCA presented 16 performances by local artists representing a range of diverse genres and communities, all of whom were compensated and given a creative opportunity to experiment and be promoted.
