INFORMATION

On February 25, 2020, the City Council held its 2020-2021 Council Policy Priority Setting session, adding and ranking seven new priority items. This memorandum captures the actions the Council took in setting the 2020-2021 Council Policy Priority List.

Updates to the 2019-2020 Council Policy Priority List

The City Council first removed eight completed priorities and one ongoing priority from the 2019-2020 Council Policy Priority List. Additionally, Council consolidated two priorities as the work is overlapping and complementary.

The updated 2019-2020 Council Policy Priority List is presented in Attachment A. The Administration projects that an additional eight items are on track to be completed by August 2020. Any items that Council deems completed before the end of the fiscal year will be removed from the 2020-2021 Council Policy Priority List.

2020-2021 Council Policy Priority List

The City Council considered 24 nominations to add to the 2020-2021 Council Policy Priority List. The full list of nominations can be found in the Supplemental Memorandum¹ and the 2020-2021 Policy Nominations Overview² prepared for the February 25, 2020 Council Item.

Each year, the Council Policy Priority Setting builds on the prior year's process. Items not yet completed remain on the list until Council votes to remove them from the list. On February 25, after removing completed items from the 2019-2020 list, the Council voted to freeze the new Top 10 given the staff work already invested in these higher-ranked items.

In considering new nominations, the voting was divided into two rounds. In Round 1, each Councilmember had 8 votes (the total number of nominations/3). Votes could not be clustered. The tally of votes³ is posted with the agenda item for the Council meeting.

With two items meeting the six-vote threshold to move forward, the Council voted to move forward the five items that had received five votes as only ten members of the Council were present.

The following items were added to the list for 2020-2021:

- Citywide Transit First Policy Framework
- Explore Procurement of a Polypropylene Plastic Purification Plant
- Flavored Tobacco and E-Cigarettes, Items 1, 2, and 3/ Protecting Our Youth from the E-Cigarette Epidemic (COMBINED)
- Private Percent for Art
- Public Safety Power Shutoffs: Making San José Grid Resilient, Item 5b (bond financing)
- Update Council Policy 5-6, Traffic Calming Policy for Residential Neighborhoods
- Single-Use Plastic Ban

In Round 2, the Council voted to rank 12 items (the seven new items and five items that were carried over from the 2019-2020 list). Each Councilmember had four votes (n/3) to indicate their

fiscal year, and updating the 2020-2021 Council Policy Priority List to reflect additional completed priorities as determined by Council;

- Develop work plans and budget recommendations regarding implementation of the 2020-2021 Council Policy Priority List;
- Continue to evaluate the successes and challenges of implementation of the 2020-2021
 Council Policy Priority List, including reporting to Committees and issuing twice-yearly progress reports; and
- Make recommendations for improvements in 2021, which will be the tenth year of Council Policy Priority Setting. This work will include exploration of the ideas presented in the memorandum from Councilmember Jimenez, as approved by Council.

Placement of a policy on the Priority List does not necessarily mean that it will be implemented. As City staff and the City Attorney's Office work on the priority list, administrative, budget and legal issues will be identified and then brought back to the City Council for further consideration.
