- *Community & Economic Development* Manage the growth and change of the community in order to create and preserve healthy neighborhoods and ensure a diverse range of employment and housing opportunities.
- *Neighborhood Services* Serve, foster, and strengthen community by providing access to lifelong learning and opportunities to enjoy life.
- *Transportation & Aviation Services* A safe and efficient transportation system that contributes to the livability and economic health of the City; and provide for the air transportation needs of the community and the region at levels that is acceptable to the community.
- *Environment and Utility Services* Manage environmental services and utility systems to ensure a sustainable environment for the community.
- *Public Safety Services* Commitment to excellence in public safety by investing in neighborhood partnerships as well as prevention, enforcement, and emergency preparedness services.

You may speak to the City Council about any discussion item that is on the agenda, and you may also speak during Open Forum on items that are not on the agenda and are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the City Council or Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency Board. If you wish to speak to the City Council, please refer to the following guidelines:

- o Each speaker generally has two minutes to speak per item. The amount of time allotted to speakers may vary at the Mayor's discretion, depending on the number of speakers or the length of the agenda.
- O To assist you in tracking your speaking time, there is a display on the podium. The green light turns on when you begin speaking; the yellow light turns on when you have 30 seconds left; and the red light turns on when your speaking time is up.

Please be advised that, by law, the City Council is unable to discuss or take action on issues presented during Open Forum. According to State Law (the Brown Act) items must first be noticed on the agenda before any discussion or action.

The San José City Council meets every Tuesday at 1:30 p.m. and Tuesday at 7 p.m. as needed, unless otherwise noted.  - (2) Authorizing the Director of Housing to issue a Request for Proposal (RFP) for development of a future affordable housing community located at 5647 Gallup and 1171 Mesa, if the City is successful in acquiring the properties.
- (b) Successor Agency adopt a resolution authorizing the Managing Director to negotiate and execute (i) a Purchase and Sale Agreement to sell that certain real property located at 5647 Gallup and 1171 Mesa in San José to the City of San José for a purchase price of \$1,170,000; and (ii) such other documents as necessary to close escrow to acquire the properties.
- (c) City Council adopt the following Appropriation Ordinance amendments in the Community Development Block Grant Fund:
 - (1) Increase the appropriation to the Housing Department for Property Acquisition in the amount of \$510,000; and
 - (2) Decrease the Land Acquisition Reserve appropriation in the amount of \$510,000.

CEQA: Exempt, File No. PP16-007. Council District 10. (City Manager) **Deferred to 4/26/16 per Orders of the Day.**
