- (c) Consider an ordinance of the City of San José amending Title 6 (Business Licenses and Regulations) of the San José Municipal Code by amending Chapter 6.88 to:
- (1) Allow each Registered Collective to conduct non-medical ("recreational/adult-use") cannabis activities;
- (2) Allow each Registered Collective to deliver non-medical cannabis to customers and establish the parameters under which deliveries could take place;
- (3) Approve other changes to update the Code to align with new state laws, amend not-for-profit requirements, update definitions; and (4) Make other technical, non-substantive, or formatting changes.

PP11-076, PP14-030, PP16-076 and PP17-070; and Statutory Exemption pursuant to Section 26055(h) of the California Business and Professions Code: Without limiting any other statutory exemption or categorical exemption, Division 13 (commencing with Section 21000) of the Public Resources Code does not apply to the adoption of an ordinance, rule, or regulation by a local jurisdiction that requires discretionary review and approval of permits, licenses, or other authorizations to engage in commercial cannabis activity. Approved, including the joint memorandum from Councilmembers Rocha, Jimenez and Khamis, dated November 9, 2017, recommending that the City Council adopt the staff recommendation and adopt the following additional staff direction: As the State releases marijuana regulations over the coming months, staff is directed to analyze how the State rules will regulate ownership of cannabis collectives, and bring forward a recommendation as to whether San Jose should allow a single cannabis business to operate more than one of the 16 dispensaries currently licensed in San Jose. (There is an existing prohibition against a single business operating more than one dispensary in San José Municipal Code section 6.88.310. See Attachment A for full text of this code section as revised by staff per their recommendation for this item.)

Also, including Items 1, 2, 4 and 5 from Councilmember Lan Diep's memorandum dated 11/13/17: (1) Allow the transfer of one's ownership of a licensed dispensary - in its entirety or by fractional share - to a new owner by sale, inheritance, or other legal means; (2) Limit any single entity from owning or having a controlling stake in no more than two licensed dispensaries within San Jose; (4) Return to Council by the autumn of 2018 (by way of an information memorandum) to provide an update on the impacts of the commercial cannabis program, such as revenues generated, associated illegal activities, code enforcement complaints, impacts to staff time and administrative resources; (5) Study the viability of an impact fee to counteract the adverse impacts of commercial cannabis, and the possibility of achieving the following with the revenue from such fees: (a) Campaigns educating minors about the dangers of cannabis; (b) More police staff to regulate the commercial activity of nonmedicinal cannabis and to combat the sale of marijuana from unlicensed sources; (c) More planning department staff to study and align San Jose's zoning with its general plan, as a prerequisite to considering the possibility of allowing the sale of cannabis outside of the currently designated areas.

#### 4.4 17-315 Amendments to the Tenant Protection Ordinance.

#### **Recommendation:**

Approve an ordinance amending Part 12 of Chapter 17.23 of Title 17 of the San José Municipal Code modifying the definition of Rental Unit to exempt restricted affordable or government operated rental units, to remove the suspension of Part 6 and 7, and to modify the scope of the exception to the material or habitual lease violation of tenancy cause for eviction to:

- (a) Remove the exception for the addition of a brother or sister to a tenant household; and
- (b) Reduce the maximum occupancy limit on that protection to the greater of the number allowed by the rental agreement or two adults per bedroom.

- (1) Retain the limit on annual rent increases as 5% with no banking, and implement a capital improvement pass through petition process for specified improvements including sustainability, safety and seismic upgrades and major system upgrades that improve housing services.

(2)Modify the annual increase to 100% of the San Francisco-Oakland-San José Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U), with a 2% floor and an 8% ceiling for annual increases, allow maximum allowable rate form of banking with a limit of 5% in any one year; implement a capital improvement pass through petition process for specified improvements including sustainability, safety and seismic upgrades, major system upgrades that improve housing services and major maintenance replacements for a five-year period, and allow the pass through of 50% of program administrative

(c) Adopt a resolution amending the 2017-2018 Schedule of Fees and Charges (Resolution No. 72737, as amended) to increase the annual Rental Rights and Referrals Program fees for rent stabilized apartments subject to San José Municipal Code Chapter 17.23 by \$25.50, from \$30.30 to \$55.80 per unit annually, effective retroactively from July 1, 2017, to be collected through a supplemental billing for the additional balance of the fee for rent stabilized units.
