- Continue targeted enforcement of high crime activity areas







CSA Workplan Highlights - Fire

- Achieve City performance goal of Fire unit arriving at the scene within 8 minutes 80% of the time and County of Santa Clara EMS goal of 90%
- Conduct Regional Fire/EMS Communications Center Study
- Continue response times
 analysis





SVRIA – Looking Ahead Silicon Valley Regional Interoperability Authority

- Build-out of the regional communications system (SVRCS)
 - Next-generation radio system
 - 700/800 MHz spectrum reserved for public safety
 - Provides for interoperability/mutual aid
 - Improved signal character, communication efficiency and features



SVRIA Silicon Valley Regional Interoperability Authority

- Projected Costs for San José
 - Radio site improvements, infrastructure, and microwave backbone upgrades \$17M (one-time)
 - Dual Band Radios (Mobile and Portable)
 \$13M (one-time)
 - Annual Operations and Maintenance cost
 \$1.8M (on-going)
