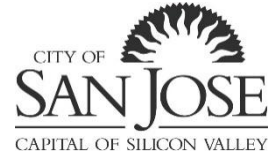


WILDFIRE STATUS IN CITY OF SAN JOSE



As of Friday August 21, 2020 - Cal Fire has issued NO warning or evacuation order within the City of San José, but please prepare for rapidly changing conditions. In some places along the city border in East San Jose, there is a mandatory evacuation area established for the unincorporated area. This may result in neighbors along the city-county border receiving different instructions. Please follow orders for your specific residence.

Evacuation Order vs. Warning - A Warning is a high probability of the need to evacuate. An Order means you are lawfully required to leave the area by a specified time.

How to View Evacuation Areas and Get Alerts – If you have a computer or cell phone with internet access:

- Sign up at www.AlertSCC.org to receive emergency alerts on your cell phone.

Resource Center - The City has opened up the [Evergreen Community Center](#) (4860 San Felipe Road, San Jose) to provide information about wildfires that might affect San Jose. Open Friday, Aug. 21 from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. and Saturday-Sunday 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Visitors are required to wear a mask, keep a 6-foot distance from others, and complete a quick health screening upon arrival. Residents will have access to free Wifi, bottled water and snacks.

Be Prepared to Evacuate

3 Key Steps	Emergency Supply Kit Checklist
<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Share an evacuation plan with family that includes where you and any pets will go. Include contact info for each person.2. Plan ahead for at least two evacuation routes.3. Assemble an Emergency Supply Kit for each person and pet in your household. <p>For more tips on being prepared and protecting your home from fire, visit ReadyForWildfire.org</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Face mask• 3 days of food and 3 gallons of water per person• Prescriptions/medications• Change of clothing and jacket• Extra eyeglasses or contact lenses• First aid kit• Flashlight• Battery-powered radio and extra batteries• Sanitation supplies• Car keys, credit cards, cash• Copies of birth certificates, passports, etc.• Pet food and water
