The following factors attribute to the difference:

- The encumbrance amount is already deducted from the beginning balance shown on the S&U Statement (encumbrances are considered as spent funds for planning purposes)
- The S&U does not include the investment income, excess bond premium and rebudgets (unspent monies from FY 19/20)
- Please keep in mind that the S&U is a snapshot in time of the 5 year budget plan; whereas, the auditor's report reflect the actual revenues and expenditures for the fiscal year.

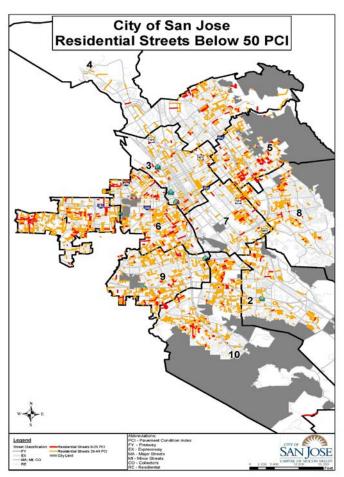

Streetlights

City Facility/Parks lights

- Focus on ensuring all parks and trails are converted
- Convert lighting by early 2024
- Lighting Controls Procurement for controllers only with future IoT capability
 - Controllers to be procured in 2021

Clean Water and Green Infrastructure (\$25,000,000)

- River Oaks Pump Station
 Stormwater Capture Project
 - Project anticipated to be completed by end of 2023

Charcot Storm Drain Improvement Project (\$35,000,000)

- Staff is proceeding with the approach to construct a new storm drain system
- Project is anticipated to be completed in 2024
