### **2020 PROGRESS: PCIA AND EQUITY**



- PCIA Data: CPUC adopted new, permanent PG&E data reporting requirements in 2021 PG&E ERRA Decision.
  - Successful media and organizing campaign with City of San Jose leadership
  - Resolves most issues in SJCE sponsored AB 2689, Kalra on PG&E data transparency
- PCIA Cost: 2020 PG&E PCIA undercollection will be amortized over 36 mo; 2021 PG&E PCIA undercollection to be amortized over 12 mo, CCA stability.
  - Commission Guzman presiding over hearing to permanently lift PCIA cap in 2022
- AMP Equity: CPUC approved use of IOU-managed public purpose funds to pay for CCA customer non-payment during COVID-19 disconnect moratorium



# **2020 PROGRESS: PROCUREMENT**



• IRP: CPUC reaffirms CCA ability to procure own resources, IOU backstop procurement only if CCAs fails to meet obligation

• RA: CalCCA joins Central Procurement Entity (CPE) Procurement Review Group (PRG); CPUC begins RA Program reform

• **Direct Access**: CPUC Legislative Report recommends limited DA expansion *only* if ESPs meet GHG, RPS and reliability criteria



### **2021 EMERGENCY RELIABILITY**



#### Outcome of Extreme Heat Storms/August 2020 Blackouts:

- Joint Agency preliminary root cause analysis
  - Identifies near-term actions to avoid a repeat in summer 2021
- CPUC 2021 Emergency Reliability proceeding
  - Seeks stakeholder input on actions to enhance Summer 2021 system reliability
  - 12/28 Ruling directs IOU procurement of incremental resources, increased Demand Response, expanded Flex Alert, and market enhancements
- CAISO 2021 Summer Readiness Initiatives

CPUC moving toward increased CCA oversight and mandated compliance requirements



### **2021 IRP**



• 2020 Procurement: 2020 Decision established IOU backstop procurement rules to govern 2019 LSE IRP Procurement mandate. Increased CCA IRP oversight and enforcement authority of CPUC.

• 2021 Procurement: Staff proposed second procurement mandate proposal expected Jan 2021. Expected to order 4-6 GW of incremental system RA in 2024-2026, related to Diablo retirement.

#### Track 3A: Central Procurement Entity (CPE) Implementation

- IOUs now responsible for local RA procurement starting 2023
- CalCCA will participate in CPE Procurement Review Group (PRG)

#### Track 3B: RA Program Reform

- How should the RA program evolve to ensure electric reliability in a decarbonized system? Proposals discuss options to:
  - Extend capacity requirements beyond mid-day peak to include evening
  - Account for both capacity and energy



### PROPOSED JANUARY BUDGET

Governor Newsom proposes \$14 billion for emergency economic recovery; allocate in January and early Spring)



- \$5 billion package to provide immediate relief for schools, small business, and low income families to addre
- \$1.5 billion investment in zero-emission ve vehicle charging infrastructure, including Ca and securitized revenue stream from vehicle registration
- Legislative Analyst's Office (LAO) <u>issued a report</u> recommending the Legislature focus large stimulus projects and spending criteria to reduce long-term climate change.
