As the City seeks solutions on creating a solid and equitable COVID-19 recovery plan, establishing an asset map for the East San José is crucial, especially for the heart of the East Side, which includes King/Story, Emma Prusch, PAL Stadium, Poco Way area, Mayfair area, Our Lady of Guadalupe Church, Mexican Heritage Plaza, Little Portugal, and Alum Rock Avenue Corridor areas. Asset mapping provides information about the strengths, weaknesses, and or resources of a community.

We know COVID-19 recovery will take years, if not decades, to recover completely. Ultimately, Asset mapping will assist in finding and providing opportunities to continue to help produce results.
