
OCA Mission

History of OCA

- Was a division of the Convention, Arts, and Entertainment Services Department, which included the management of the convention and cultural facilities.
- In 2006, CAE dissolved as the City privatized the management of the City-owned. convention and cultural facilities. (Team San Jose formed.)
- OCA became division of OED with up to 23 FTE a majority funded through GF.
- During Great Recession, OCA reduced to 10 FTE with all transferred to TOT or % for art funds.
- OCA takes on cultural facility O&M portfolio from CMO
- OCA takes on TSJ portfolio (previously in CMO, then OED)
- 2 FTE added to bring to 12 FTE

Arts Industry Support

- Grants and Technical Assistance for nonprofits, artists & artbusinesses – about 180 grants p/yr, \$5.5 M in 18-19
- Cultural Facilities O&M Contracts & Stewardship (CDM, Hammer Theatre, HSJ, MHP, SJMA, Tech)
