




45 fatalities since January 1st

- 49% (22/45) occurred on Priority Safety Corridors
- 7 occurred on Monterey Road (4 unhoused)
- 69% (31/45) occurred in dark hours
- 18% (8/45) involved motorcycle
- 40% (18/45) involved people walking
 - 67% (12/18) involved people crossing outside of crosswalks
- 71% (32/45) involved male driver
- 31% (14/45) was caused by speeding






Vision Zero Task Force (5) Quick Build Data-Driven Safety Improvements

Monterey Rd & Curtner Ave/Tully Rd

- 3 pedestrian fatalities (Unhoused)
- 2 pedestrian fatalities nearby along Monterey Rd

Efforts Underway:

- Working with Medical Examiner Coroner to determine which traffic fatalities involve unhoused decedents
- Median island fencing (Curtner/Tully Rail crossing)
- Partnership with Housing to outreach unhoused population
- Intersection Safety Redesign (Quick Build, Pavement)
- Discussing safety audit and outreach partnership with VTA
- Exploring signal timing operational improvements
- Targeted Outreach, Safety Education



November 2021 to February 2024

Main deliverables:

- 1. CalWalks: Inclusive outreach to determine focus areas
- 2. Quick Build street redesigns (D3,5,6,7)
- 3. Multi-stakeholder safety/placemaking strategies



District 3 - Characteristics, Community Feedback & Study Areas

Characteristics:

San José District 3 is the cultural, civic, and economic center of San José, encompassing <u>downtown</u> at its core and reaching out to include several of the most diverse neighborhoods in the city, including <u>Japan Toom. Little</u> tity, and <u>Little Portugal</u>. Also present are landmarks lites San José Sate University, the SAT Center, Mineta San José International Airport, and the new Berryessa BART station. The two future BART stations (28th Street and Downtown) are also planned to be in District 3.

The downlown business district is home to most of the city's art, entertainment and cultural venues. Because the downlown area is considered in several past and existing planning efforts, for the specific area study, Waik Safe San José will focus on other areas with vulnerable populations in District 3. The district wise study will comprehensively review and provide stategies for the entre district, including the downlown area.

Community Feedback:

San José Diatrict 3 has the <u>second highest frequency of fatal and severe injuries</u> (2015-2019) in San José. Last summer, California Walks received several commity feedback about transportation network in District 3, including concernes about unsate conditions for walking, wide streets, and speeding issue.

Vision Zero Task Force 2. Reports and Updates: C. Legislative Update

2021 AB 43 (Friedman) – Traffic Safety

- Flexibility to lower the speed limit on high injury and fatality streets near vulnerable populations (including children, seniors, people with disabilities, and people experiencing homelessness), and contiguous to a business activity district.
- Waiting to get signed by the Governor
- Mayor Liccardo submitted a letter to the Governor on behalf of San Jose
