



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

• SB 612 (Portantino) - Fair Access to Legacy Resources, 2 yr bill

2021-2022 California Budget Bill:

- Debt Funding: California Arrearage Payment Plan (CAPP) **\$1Bil** for electric customer debt, payments allocated proportionately to IOUs, POUs, and CCAs for 2020 customer debt.
- Resiliency Funding: S Integrated Climate Adaptation and Resiliency Program \$100Mil in grants in 2022-2024 for projects to mitigate extreme heat; Strategic Growth Council \$100M in grants in 2022-2024 for community resiliency centers

2021 Federal Funding Bills

- \$1Trillion Infrastructure Investment Act, HR 3684, bi-partisan, \$550B new funds over eight years, increases to transit, EVs, and electric grid infrastructure
- \$3.5 Trillion Reconciliation Budget Bill, Democrat-led, changes US tax code

REGULATORY UPDATE

- 2022 PG&E ERRA filing could lower 2022 PCIA tariff
 - Higher 2020 and 2021 energy prices increase market value of PG&E assets placing downward pressure on 2022 "above market" PG&E PCIA tariff.
 - PG&E November Update and filings will establish 2022 PG&E PCIA tariff
- 2023 PG&E General Rate Case filing includes 17% increase in PG&E residential rates relative to 2021 rates, (2023-2027).
 - Tracking potential cost shift from PG&E generation to distribution rates
 - Added utility capital cost request could influence 2024 PG&E PCIA tariff



REGULATORY UPDATE

CPUC IRP "emergency reliability" mandates impact SJCE IRP requirements

- 2019 IRP Mandate: 3.0 GW 2021-23 new install
 - SJCE on track with 2021 38.8 MW obligation, avoid IOU IRP backstop or penalty
- 2021 IRP Mandate: 11.5 GW 2023-26 new install
 - SJCE analyzing procurement amount, resource mix, and timing, including PV+ES
 - Expect 248 MW SJCE proportional requirement
- 2021 add'l IRP Proposal: 5 GW 2022-23 expedited install
 - SJCE proportional amount will depend on final CPUC ruling



REGULATORY UPDATE

- High Distributed Energy Resources (DER) and GridMod
 - Joint CCAs participating to address DER cost treatment and preservation of CCA ability to competitively offer DER and microgrid service

NEM 3.0 Successor Tariff

- SJCE a party to support CSJ Climate Action Plan goal of 1GW rooftop solar and expansion of solar across the State
- Support solar industry and environmental group position:
 - gradual reduction of NEM credit over time
 - Preserve NEM 1.0 and 2.0 for existing customers
 - No new PG&E distribution charge PG&E proposes new \$80/mo distribution fee
