

Redistricting Principles

- Relatively equal size people, not citizens
- Contiguous districts should not hop/jump
- Maintain "communities of interest"
- Follow existing neighborhoods
- Keep districts compact appearance/function
- Up to 10% population deviation allowed










Community Map 2.0 vs. Current Districts



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Community Map 2.0: Changes from Current SJ Districts

- District 1: no changes
- **District 2:** Moved bottom half of Ramblewood/Tuers to D7 for congruity
- District 3:
 - Little Portugal, Five Wounds, and Brookwood Terrace (FWBT) kept together
 - 13th St. Neighborhood Advisory Committee: Northside, Julian St-James, Historic Hensley, Horace Mann, and connections to Japantown, Hyde Park, Vendome and Ryland Park.
 - Keeps SJSU campus, students and staff with the surrounding neighborhoods: South University, SoFA, and Naglee Park kept together
 - Communities south of 280 are kept together in D7 and no longer separated by 280.
 - Delmas / Gardner District is moved to D6 and no longer separated by 87 and 280.
 - Small northern section of Newhall moved from D3 to D6 to complete the neighborhood.
 - Extended into District 4 to absorb D4's excess population

Community Map 2.0: Changes from Current SJ Districts

- District 4:
 - Penitencia Creek, Flea Market, Berryessa Bart kept in D4.
 - D3 and D5 expanded into D4 to absorb excess population.
- District 5:
 - Extended north to reduce population in D4.
 - Checkers neighborhood expanded to balance D3/D4/D5 population.
 - Keeps Reid-Hillview Airport in D5 (keep lower D5 border the same)
 - Correction to Little Portugal area along Santa Clara St.
- District 6:
 - Gardner neighborhood is no longer separated by freeways 280 and 87
 - Shifted Briarwood & Willow Vale [Source: D6 WGNA input] from D9 to D6
 - Moved Farm & Rubino to expand D9 population
 - Small northern section of Newhall moved from D3 to D6 to complete the neighborhood.

Community Map 2.0: Changes from Current SJ Districts

- District 7:
 - Moved from D3 to D7: Spartan-Keyes, Goodyear, Guadalupe Washington, Tamien (keep together)
 - No longer divided by 280 FWY from rest of the district.
 - Valley Palms moved from D7 to D8 (same as SJ Draft Plan D map)
 - Communications Hill moved to D10 to extend D10 population.
- District 8 : Extended into Valley Palms (same as SJ Draft Plan D map)
 - Reid-Hillview corrected to remain in existing D5
- District 9:
 - Expanded into D6 Farm & Rubino to increase population
 - Shifted Briarwood & Willow Vale [Source: D6 WGNA input] to D6
- **District 10:** Extended north to include Communications Hill to increase population

Redistrict Mapping Tool Needs more Granular Section Little Portugal Area between D3 & D5

- Keep Portuguese community & businesses west & east of 280 together along Alum Rock Ave. in D3.
- ALL residents on Shortridge Ave. (both sides of the st.) remain in D5 (between S 31st & King)
- Esther Medina Park in D5 (bordered by Hwy 101, S. 31st, Alum Rock, & E. San Antonio)



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
