3	George C. Payne Ranch Park	Honors the former owner of the ranch where the park site is located who was a renowned horticulturalist and was known for his pioneering achievements in grafting walnuts. 4	Helen Payne Park	Honors Helen Schultz Payne, wife of George Payne.	An individual who has been deceased for at least five years. It should be noted that the family did not gift the park site to the City. Instead, the City acquired the park by purchasing it from the Pueblo de Dios church.
5	Nikola Tesla Park	Honors the inventor and engineer whose inventions in electrical supply and other items contributed to the technological advancement of society.
