








Government Sponsored Genocide & Land Theft

Governor Peter Hardeman Burnett, in a second state of address in the state Capitol of San José, says, "That a war of extermination will continue to be waged between the races until the Indian race becomes extinct must be expected."



In 1851, Governor Peter Burnett prophesied "That a war of extermination will continue to be waged between the races, until the Indian race becomes extinct" (Peter H. Burnett, "Governor's Message," in California, California Legislature, 1851, 15). Unknown artist,


California, a "Free State" Sanctioned Slavery

The series of bills admitted California as a free state, while also granting concessions to the South, including the federal Fugitive Slave Act, which required government officials and white citizens in all states and territories to actively assist slaveholders to recapture formerly enslaved people who escaped from slave-holding jurisdictions.



Government facilitated Land Grab from Mexican Families

- Most Latinos experienced rapid economic and political disenfranchisement post the Treaty of Guadalupe Hildalgo in 1848
- By 1860, only 20 men and 6 women in San Jose's ethnic Mexican community of over 900 held property in the county.
- "Of all the California families, perhaps ours can most justly complain about the bad faith adventurers and squatters and about the illegal activities of the American lawyers."




Alien Land Laws Prevented Asians from Owning Property

"In the matter of Chinese and Japanese coolie immigration I stand for the national policy of exclusion (or restricted immigration)...We cannot make a homogeneous population out of people who do not blend with the Caucasian race...Oriental coolieism will give us another race problem to solve, and surely we have had our lesson." - President Woodrow Wilson

Post WWII policies and investments that contributed to segregation in San José

- Annexation
- Subdivision
- Federal underwriting of single-family home development
- Racially restrictive covenants
- Siting and funding of infrastructure (roads, freeways, utilities, etc.)
- Zoning/planning and land use siting
- Allocation and maintenance of parks, trees, community centers and other neighborhood amenities











Piston-Engine Aircraft Traffic and Child BLLs






Effects of toxic lead-based fuel







Need for Fair Housing

Initially explicit



Government explicitly creates and maintains racial inequity.

Became implicit



Discrimination illegal, but "race-neutral" policies and practices perpetuate inequity.

Government for racial equity



Proactive policies, practices and procedures that advance racial equity.





Need for Fair Housing

In 2018, California passed AB 686 as the statewide framework to affirmatively further fair housing; to promote inclusive communities, further housing choice, and address racial and economic disparities through government programs, policies, and operations.





Housing Element

- While local governments do not build housing, they do create the rules that shape where housing can be built, what types and how much
- It includes policies and programs that address housing needs for all types of households including those with special housing needs or at different income levels, and solutions
- NEW: Fair housing analysis, policies and programs.
