Sonya,

There is no prohibition in the Municipal Code limiting what information candidates can use in their promotional materials or candidate statement. The rules you reference in your question are specific to City employees, not candidates in general. The County Court system may have rules regarding the use of one's title and uniform when serving as a Pro Term Judge. We cannot advise on those rules, if any. You may contact the appropriate organization for further guidance on what is appropriate.
