
History of Mobile Crisis Assessment Team (MCAT)

- **❖** In 2018, San Jose Police Department applied for a grant through the Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance.
- **❖** The purpose of the grant is to collaborate with the County of Santa Clara Behavioral Health in the development and implementation of a new program for individuals in the community dealing with mental illness.
- **❖** In September 2018, the San Jose Police Department was awarded \$750,000 to fund a coresponder program in collaboration with the County of Santa Clara Behavioral Health.
- **❖** In August 2019, the San Jose Police Department and County of Santa Clara Behavioral Health established a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) that outlined the roles and responsibilities between the two agencies.
- **❖** In October of 2020, the pilot collaboration co-responder program commences between the San Jose Police Department and the County of Santa Clara Behavioral Health.
- **❖** In March of 2021, 2 Sergeants and 4 officers were assigned to the pilot program on a TDY assignment for one year.
