This budget action requests direction to the City Manager to collaborate with department heads in exploring and evaluating a hybrid security system at SJC that will utilize San José Police Department (SJPD) officers to supervise and work alongside contracted security.

This budget action will preserve the critical airport security need to have contract security officers report to SJPD command staff through established chain of command. More importantly, this proposal will minimize the potential challenges in communication and coordination that could occur if the entire security operations at SJC are outsourced.

During the crisis that our country faced with the 9/11 attacks, a significant loss of life occurred due to inadequate coordination and the inability of responders to communicate. This was due to non-interoperable radio systems utilized by various agencies. Implementing a unified security response protocol under an integrated central command structure would prevent difficulties in communication and coordination in the event of a public emergency or other unanticipated critical incident at SJC.

If this budget document is approved, a hybrid security system could ensure that SJC maintains the highest level of safety for the airlines, airport staff, general public, and final destination communities of flights originating in San José.
