#### **INFORMATION**

#### **BACKGROUND**

This memorandum reports on the financial assistance provided by the City of San José for Fiscal Year 2020-2021 to Community Based Organizations (CBOs), and the key activities of the Nonprofit Strategic Engagement Platform (Nonprofit Platform).

The Nonprofit Platform was developed at the direction of City Council in 2010 to enhance the oversight and impact of City funding provided to CBOs. The focus of the Nonprofit Platform is interdepartmental consistency regarding the City's policies and procedures for contract preparation and administration. Other critical elements of the Nonprofit Platform are program and fiscal monitoring of CBO performance and overall financial condition, in order to comprehensively assess impact and ultimately inform City funding decisions in subsequent years.

One element of the Nonprofit Platform is the City's Grants Management Working Group that meets monthly to share best practices, exchange information relevant to grants, and support the departments in effectively administering and managing the City's grant programs. Each department that administers grant programs has one or more representatives in the Grants Management Working Group. As part of its diligence, the group reviews financial dashboards from organizations receiving over \$25,000 in financial assistance from the City. A comparison is made to previous dashboards to observe year to year trends in the fiscal capacity of the grantee.

Information in this report was collected from WebGrants, the City's automated grant management system, the technological underpinning of the City's grant management process, as well as supplementary data collected directly from the departments. The Grants Management Working Group members are responsible for ensuring their department's data is correct and up to date in WebGrants. The WebGrants system allows for online posting of funding

opportunities, submission of applications, evaluation and scoring of applications, and notification of awards. After a grant has been awarded, grantees can submit status reports and invoices through the system. The WebGrants database can be queried to provide an open source of City grant related information.

Initially this memorandum was intended as a report on the activities, deliverables, and upcoming strategic focus of the Nonprofit Platform in relation to the 2008 Audit of the City's Oversight of Financial Assistance to Community Based Organizations. As the audit responses have evolved into solid Citywide policies and procedures, the report has become a more quantitative analysis of total funding, including not only grants, but also operations and maintenance agreements, inkind contributions, and below-market leases.

The information contained in this memorandum is for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021.

#### **ANALYSIS**

Since FY 2011-2012, the City has collected data on financial assistance to CBOs using WebGrants, an online grant management system. Data from that system was used to create this memorandum for FY 2020-2021.

As of June 30, 2021, the City has provided \$89,061,783 of combined financial assistance to CBOs in the form of grants, in-kind support, below market leases, and operations and maintenance agreements. Of that amount, \$79,058,537 was provided in grants, \$384,000 of in-kind support, \$5,791,746 in below market leases, and \$3,827,500 in operations and maintenance (See Diagram 1 on the following page).

Total funding including all types increased from \$51,733,479 in FY 2018-2019 to \$62,064,134 in FY 2019-2020, then to \$89,061,783 in FY 2020-2021 (See Diagram 2 on the following page). These significant increases in total funding were almost exclusively due to an increase in grant assistance associated with the CARES Act.






#### **Grant Funding**

As of June 30, 2021, the City of San José awarded grants totaling \$79,058,537 to 256 different organizations to support a wide range of services, including housing, workforce development, cultural programs, and services to underserved populations. As some organizations were awarded multiple grants, the total number of grants awarded was 439. Diagram 3 below shows the sources of funds for these grants.

In most cases, the funding sources are restricted for specific purposes with guidelines for use. Other grant programs are funded with the City's General Fund.

#### **In-Kind Support**

As reported by the Departments, one (1) CBO, Christmas in the Park, Inc., received \$384,000 of in-kind contributions. In-kind support may include staffing, supplies, facilities, or storage space. In the case of Christmas in the Park, Inc. the in-kind support was use of the warehouse where their items are stored when not in use.

#### **Below Market Leases**

The City provided an additional \$5,791,746 in below market leases to eighteen (18) CBOs., which are listed in the Appendix to this memorandum. The fair market value of City-owned properties was calculated, and the annualized amount paid by the CBOs subtracted to get the amount of subsidization.

The below market leases are managed by the Office of Economic Development (OED), the Department of Transportation, and Parks, Recreation, and Neighborhood Services.

#### **Looking Ahead**

The City-wide Grants Management Working Group is working through a transition to be less dependent on a few key members. Training in the use of the City's WebGrants system is being conducted, and training sessions are recorded for use by those unable to attend. Training videos are currently available on topics including how to add new users, how to create a new grant, how to create the forms that applicants use to apply for grants and review panels use to review applications, and many other WebGrants functions.
