




Shelter Crisis

◆ 5,117 unsheltered homeless individuals

▲ 1,506 emergency shelter beds

OWL Overview

▲ Two City-owned locations:

Council District	Site	Address
7	Leininger Center	1300 Senter Road
8	Evergreen Branch Library	2635 Aborn Road

- 60 additional shelter beds
- **▲** Nightly shelter from December 20, 2021 to April 30, 2022
- ★ Hours of Operation: 8pm 7am
- Operator: HomeFirst



OWL Site Selection

- **▲** Assessment based on minimum criteria:
 - Proximity of known concentrations of homeless populations living outdoors in potentially unsafe and exposed areas
 - Access to additional nearby supportive services and public transportation
- **▲** Site accessibility and layout, including:
 - Two points of entry and exit
 - Accessible restroom facilities
 - At least a 1,500 square foot room (to serve 30 people with social distancing)
 - At least 8 parking spaces for staff and storage of equipment
 - Site rotation & previous OWL locations


