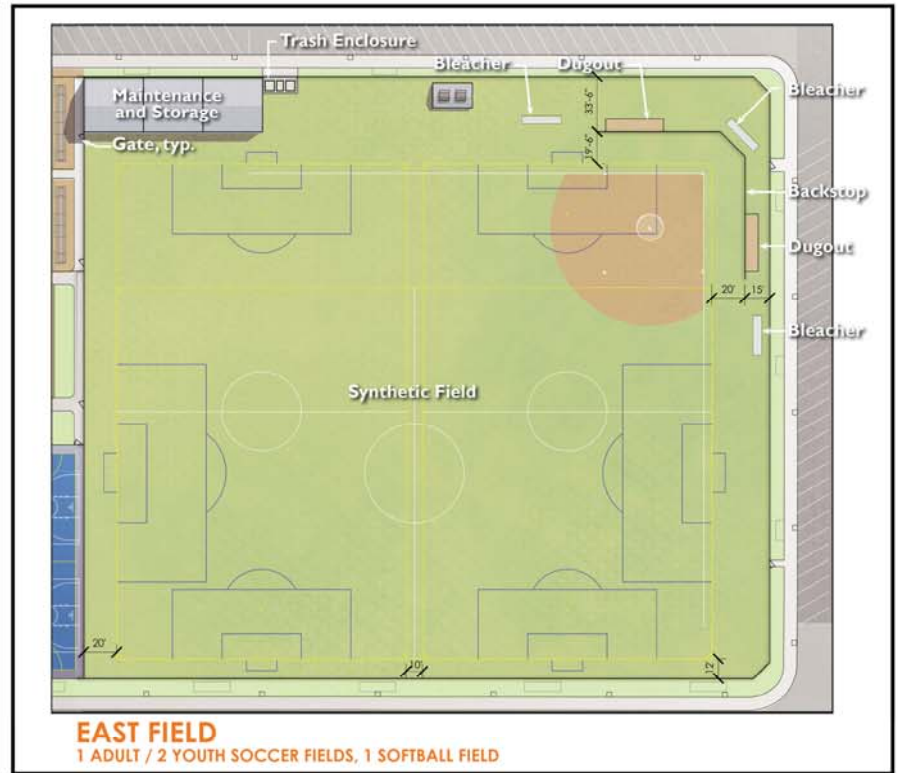
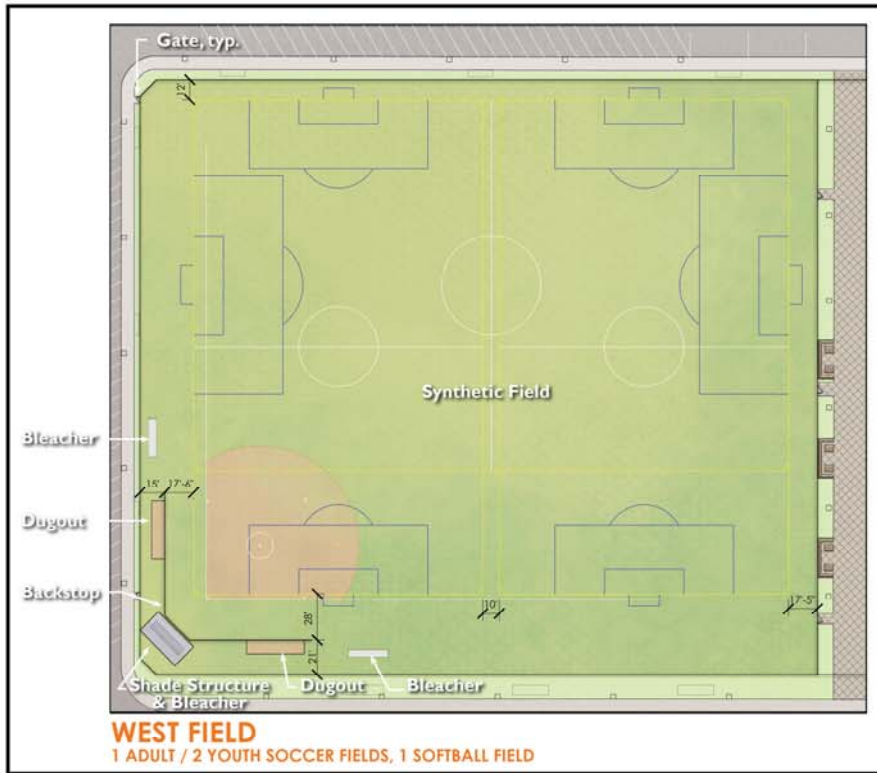


East Block – Park 1
