2022 Rate Notice Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the proposed rate change for FY 2022-2023?

The proposed rate increase is approximately 9 percent for Single-Family residents. See table 1 for monthly and annual costs for the various residential rate categories:

2. Why are rates changing?

The Sanitary Sewer Service and Use Charge (SSUC) covers costs associated with the operation and maintenance of the San José-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility (Facility) and San José's 2,200-mile sewage collection system. This also includes capital and equipment improvements; meeting regulatory requirements; program administration; and helping to enhance and restore the natural habitat that surrounds the Facility. Funding must be self-supporting and cannot be supported by other funds. The proposed rate increase is required to ensure all regulatory requirements are met and to ensure effective operation and maintenance and infrastructure capital improvements of the sanitary sewer collection system and San Jose-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility.

San José did not have a Sanitary Sewer Service and Use Charge rate increase during the current fiscal year that started July 1, 2021. The City of San José recognizes that these are unprecedented and difficult times. The current notice identifies the highest potential sanitary sewer rate changes; proposed rate changes may be lower when presented to Council for approval.

3. How much have residential single-family rates changed in the last few years?

4. Will there be another rate change next year too?

The need for rate changes is evaluated each year. If changes to rates are needed, rate notices will be sent, with information about the public hearing, and the protest process.

5. Will money from Sanitary Sewer rates be used for other projects elsewhere in the City?

No, Sanitary Sewer Service and Use Charge funds can only be used to pay for sanitary sewer related services. It cannot be used to pay for other City services such as parks, or libraries

6. The amount on my property tax for Sewer Services is higher than the rates mentioned in the letter.

The fees for Sanitary Sewer and Storm sewer are combined as one line item on your property tax bill. Currently, for a single-family home, the amount for Sewer Sani/Storm should be \$594.12.

Residential service charges are placed on the property tax roll and collected by the County of Santa Clara County, Department of Tax and Collections.

7. I am a senior and on a fixed income, are there any reduced rates?

There are no senior or low-income subsidized rates. All users of the Sanitary Sewer System are required to pay their share of the cost.
