MEETING SUMMARY

COVID-19 Recovery Task Force Update

After welcoming and housekeeping, Rosalynn Hughey provided general updates on recent Recovery-related presentations by City staff and extended an invitation to Task Force members to announce upcoming events, activities, or announcements to share.

Staff played the tribute video created by the City of San José COVID-19 Recovery and Response team, in partnership with the Department of Parks, Recreation, Neighborhood Services Department to capture the struggles, challenges and sacrifices made by the San José community, City employees and partners.

Community Engagement Plan

Carlos Velazquez and Community Engagement Committee Chair Araceli Gonzalez shared an overview of the Community Engagement Plan (Plan) that will serve as the guiding document for Task Force community engagement activities during summer 2022. Topics discussed included goals, principles, strategies, tactics, as well as the process for selecting members of the Lived Experience Group, a key strategy of the plan. The following is a summary of Task Force comments on the Plan:

- A consideration for cultural workers or arts organizations should be included as lived experience criteria.
- Adding a childcare worker and/or family care home providers as a lived experience criteria.
- A consideration for the Domestic Employers Network to be an intermediary organization.
- Foster youth or homeless youth as a lived experience criteria.
- Quency Phillips of Lighthouse/Building Back Better offered to host an event as part of the Plan's tactics.
- Input and feedback on the community survey by Task Force members to ensure impacted communities are reached.
- Consideration to add Veggielution as an intermediary organization.

Public Comment

Two members of the public spoke. The first person mentioned the importance of including middle schools or East Side school districts that were impacted by COVID-19. The second person spoke about how the Task Force and Lived Experience Group should create long-lasting innovative solutions.
