Analysis







- ☐ Before Fines levied against the person using fireworks or owner if they had knowledge
- □ Now Liability extended to social host and property owner(s) jointly and severally
- ☐ Who The social host, property owner and tenant



Intent

- Deter Anyone hosting gatherings with fireworks
- Encourage Host to prevent guests from using fireworks
- ☐ Fees & Charges Represent actual cost of emergency service **only**
- ☐ Tools Provides an additional tool for enforcement
