BENEFITS OF CITIZENSHIP

- Vote
- Travel with a U.S. Passport
- Petition certain family members
- Hold public office and obtain government jobs
- Leave the United States for an unlimited amount of time and not lose your U.S. citizenship
- Once you become a US citizen, there is a possibility that your children can derive or acquire citizenship through you - This requires an additional process with USCIS
 - Additional Benefits:
- You will no longer have to renew your immigration status every ten (10) years
- You can no longer be deported or be refused entry into the United States

Who can apply for citizenship?

- Green card holder for at least 5 years (or 3 years if married to a U.S. Citizen). The earliest you can apply is 3 months before you reach your 5 or 3 year anniversary as a green card holder
- Have established a 3 month residence in the district where you intend to apply for citizenship
- You have maintained continuous residence in the U.S. for at least 5 years, meaning you have not taken a trip of 6 months or more outside the U.S. in the last 5 years
- Have been physically present in the U.S. for more than half of the last 5 (or 3) year period in total (913 days, or 548 days)
- If you have taken a trip outside of the U.S. lasting more than 1 full year within the last
 5 (or 3) years, you will not meet the continuous residence requirement



Who can apply for citizenship?

- People who can pass a test in U.S. civics and government
- If a person is at least 65 years old and has had the green card for at least 20 years; they can take the test in their native language AND will be given an easier civics test
- A medical exception for the English requirement or civics test may also be given to those who qualify for a disability waiver (To qualify for the waiver, you must have a medical condition that makes you unable to learn or retain information. The required form (N-648) must be completed by your doctor and included with your application packet)



Who can apply for citizenship?

- People who have maintained good moral character
- People who can speak, read, and write basic English.

EXCEPTIONS:

- Those who are at least 50 years old and had a green card for 20 years;
 or
- Those who are at least 55 years old and had a green card for at least 15 years.

IF this applies to you, you can take the test in your native language



WHAT YOU NEED TO APPLY:

- Green card or copy of your green card
- List of addresses & employment for last 5 years
- List of trips outside of the U.S. for last 5 years (you may refer to your passport)
- Information about your family (parents, children, spouses)
- Court or immigration records if any
- Filing fee or fee waiver documents



APPLICATION FEE

FILING FEE:

\$725 Check or Money Order payable to: U.S. Department of Homeland Security

(\$640 for Applicants 75 years of age or older)

***USCIS is not raising fees at this time. We do not know yet if they will raise fees in the near future.



FILING FEE WAIVER

Right now, a fee waiver is available for those with limited income.

You can apply for a fee waiver if:

- You are currently receiving public benefits
- Your income as of your last tax return (2021) is less than 150% of the poverty guidelines
- You can prove a serious financial hardship
