



Expected growth












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

Community Desires (Fall 2020)

Respondents expressed a need for safer and easier access to jobs, businesses, entertainment venues, and homes in Downtown, including for the delivery of goods. They also expressed a desire for safe, efficient, and comfortable travel options for people of all ages and abilities.

- Transit: We need faster travel times, shorter wait times, and more reliable service.
- Santa Clara Street: We need a main street that is safer and more iconic. It should have more active storefronts.
- Freeways: We need safe and efficient connections between key destinations across freeway barriers that degrade public spaces.

- Walking and Biking: We need physical separation from cars, safer crossings, and more car-free streets.
- Street life: We need safer, more attractive places with outdoor dining, urban greening, and parklets that promote key destinations.


Guiding Principles



All these improvements come with tradeoffs. You and your neighbors may have different priorities depending on your needs today and ideas for tomorrow.

The Downtown Transportation Plan will identify new types of streets for the downtown area. By planning for certain streets to work better for certain types of transportation, we can do a better job of deciding which improvements to make.

We've heard about some big problems from the community. And we've thought about some big projects to help fix them. These larger-scale improvements are what we are calling "Big Moves." They will need more planning, outreach, and funding to become reality.

Big Move Idea #1 Enhancing Santa Clara Street

- Creating dedicated lanes for transit and other public services
- Significantly widening sidewalks
- Expanding outdoor space
- Converting it to a plaza-like street focusing on public life, transit access, and walking and biking, with restricted vehicle access.

Big Move Idea #2 Fixing Gaps in Trail Network

- Grade-separated rail corridor bikeway
- Japantown Highline: Elevated bikeway along rail tracks?



Premium Walking Corridors prioritize:

- Wide sidewalks
- Outdoor vendors/dining
- Ground floor retail
- High visibility/Frequent crosswalks
- Signs and markings
- **Better lighting**
- Nice landscaping
- Parklets (small public space)
- Slow traffic speeds
- Loading zones
- Short-term metered parking

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Rest areas






Premium Biking Corridors prioritize:


- Protected bike lanes/sidepaths
- Slow shared streets
- Raised bike paths
- Bikeshare stations
- Bike/scooter parking corals
- Bike lockers
- Curb extensions
- Traffic calming
- Bike signal
- Better lighting
- Signs and markings
- Nice landscaping
- Permeable pavement
- Bioswales
- Loading zones
- Short-term metered parking
