MEETING SUMMARY

COVID-19 Recovery Task Force Update

Rosalynn Hughey updated the Task Force on the Promotores Program. The City will be working with three community-based organizations: Community Health Partnerships, CommUniverCity, and Si Se Puede Collective. Twenty-one Promotores have been trained and have started doing outreach in the community.

Staff shared that the Community and Economic Development Committee will meet on Monday, October 24, and staff will give an update on the COVID-19 Recovery Task Force. The meeting

will start at 1:30 pm and will be hybrid. Lastly, the Task Force was reminded that their last meeting will be held on Thursday, November 10th.

Presentation and Action on Task Force Committees' Draft Recommendations and Budget Allocations

A total of 87 draft recommendations have been drafted by all the committees, with ten recommendations with funding allocations. The chairs or co-chairs of each of the seven committees presented as followed: Childcare, Early Care and Education, and Youth Development, Community Engagement, Community Health and Wellness, Housing, Just Recovery for Airport, Hotel, and Arts Works, Supporting Small Businesses, and Workers Health, Safety, and Rights. Each committee presented its goal and top five draft recommendations. <u>The</u> <u>full presentation can be found here.</u>

Following all the presentations, Task Force members ask questions and engaged in discussion, which resulted in a few modifications: Recommendations 4.3 and 5.3 from the Childcare, Early Care and Education, and Youth Development Committee; and Recommendation 2.6 from the Community Health and Wellness Committee.

City staff proposed three voting options in order to get to a final determination for the November 10th meeting. After discussion, a motion was put forth for no vote for the evening

and to further discuss and refine recommendations at the Steering Committee meeting on October 26th. The final vote will be at the final Task Force meeting on November 10th.
