POSITION

The Office of the City Attorney for the City of San José is seeking an experienced trial lawyer for the position of Chief Deputy City Attorney. This position serves as the lead trial attorney for the City's most challenging cases, has supervisory responsibility for cases assigned to Deputy and Sr. Deputy attorneys, and provides leadership, guidance and training to the City's litigation team.

The total salary range is \$189,488 to \$286,979. This amount includes an approximate five percent (5%) ongoing non-pensionable pay. Actual salary shall be determined by the final candidates' qualifications and experience.

QUALIFICATIONS

Applicants must be an active member of the State Bar of California. The Office seeks applicants with a minimum of 10-years civil trial experience in both state and federal courts. A public law background, emphasizing municipal law, is highly desirable. The successful candidate is an accomplished trial lawyer and demonstrated leader who develops and maintains collaborative teamwork, and inspires confidence in clients and colleagues.

Per the City's COVID-19 Mandatory Vaccination Policy, the City requires all employees starting on or after February 11, 2022 to provide proof of vaccination as a condition of employment absent a documented medical and/or religious exemption. Consistent with the Santa Clara County Public Health Order issued on December 28, 2021, "up-to-date" means that employees are required to be vaccinated with the entire recommended initial series of a COVID-19 vaccine (two doses of the Pfizer, Moderna or Novavax COVID-19 vaccine or a single dose of the Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine).
