Our Mission

The City of San José recognizes that arts and culture are essential elements in the character and quality of life in a vibrant community and seeks to ensure that San José is an effective hub of a wide array of arts and cultural opportunities throughout Silicon Valley.

The Office of Cultural Affairs (OCA) is the lead City of San José agency for championing and stewarding a vibrant arts sector.

Cultural Funding Portfolio:

• <u>Festival, Parade, and Celebration Grants (FPC)</u> Support for publicly-accessible community festivals, parades, and celebrations in San Jose by nonprofit organizations.

Operating Grants (OpG)

Support for operations for San Jose arts organizations with professional staff.

take pART Grants

Support for publicly-accessible arts activities in San Jose by San Jose nonprofit organizations.



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Purpose: take pART Grants

Support project specific arts activities by small semi-professional and professional arts organizations, as well as, by non-professional arts organizations and community service organizations with continuing arts programs.

take pART Grants are intended to encourage:

- Public participation in arts and cultural activities;
- Life-long arts and cultural education (outside of school settings);
- Expressions of culturally-specific traditions;
- Arts in neighborhood and community settings;
- Programs that serve the needs of the clients of health and social service institutions.



Eligibility:

- Organization located in San Jose or majority of programming in San Jose if org budget < \$150K.
- 501(c)(3) nonprofit status or a fiscal sponsor.
- At least a one-year history of providing arts programs in ADA accessible venue in San Jose.
- Project: 1) has expenses of at least \$5,000; and
 2) takes place between July 1, 2023 June 30,
 2024 in the city of San Jose.
- The group is in good standing with any previous grant it has received through OCA.



Not Eligible:

- Fundraising Events
- In-school projects that primarily benefit students of a specific school or school district
- Projects that convey a religious message or advocate a political position
- Funding from take pART for a Festival, Parade and Celebration (FPC) Grant-funded event
 - (May apply to take pART and FPC for separate projects)
- Groups that submit a FY 2023-2024 Operating Grant application

Amount:

Grant requests may be between \$2,500 to \$25,000—but may not exceed:

- 25% of the organization's entire organization expenses in most recent fiscal year.
- 50% of the project's cost (whichever is less).

One-Year and Two-Year Application Option:

In addition to the criteria noted above, organizations are eligible to submit a two-year application that covers both the FY 2023-2024 and FY 2024-2025 cycles if they meet the following criteria:

- Have received a take pART or OCA grant award for three consecutive funding cycles.
- The project scope and budget does not change more than 15% for the second year.
- Have met the requirements of any current and previous grants administered by the Office of Cultural Affairs.

For Two-Year Applications:

- The application <u>score</u> received for FY 2023-2024 would carry over for FY 2024-2025.
 - <u>Note:</u> The grant amount may differ each year as it is dependent on the total amount of funding available (TOT), and the number of grants awarded each year.
- A progress report on the first year's event activities and budget will be required at the end of FY 2023-2024.
- Two-Year applicants may choose to apply again the second year if trying for a better score. Keep in mind, however, that the second year's score, even if lower than the previous score, will be used in the funding recommendation process.



Application Components:

- General Information
- Sources of Funds Statement
- Organization Information
- Attachments Including
 - Project Narrative Form
 - Project Budget Form
 - Board Roster
 - Supporting Materials (such as video links, digital copies of brochures, press reviews, or articles (3 max)

First Time Applicants Only

- 501(c)3 determination letter.
- Certified Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws.



Review/Scoring Criteria:

- Project/Program Quality (40%)
- Community Impact (30%)
- Organizational Capacity (20%)
- Appropriateness of Budget and Grant Request (10%)

Review process:

- Applications are reviewed by independent panel of experts – those with expertise in arts & culture and/or events (Staff does not score applications)
- Panel meetings are public and via Zoom (recorded)
- Applicants may address the panel for 2 minutes during the review of their application (optional)
 - Staff will send schedule in advance

Timeline take pART:

February 6, 2023 5:00 PM – Application Deadline

March 23-24, 2023 – Review Panel Meeting (via Zoom Webinar)

May 15, 2023 – Recommendations to Arts Commission

June 2023 – City FY 2022-2023 Budget Adopted

July-Aug 2023- Contracts sent (once grantees have provided needed insurance documents)

Contractual Requirements:

- Good standing with IRS, CA DOJ, CA FTB and CA SOS
- Current City of San Jose Business License
- Submitted COI per Insurance Requirements
- Final Report from last grant
- Acknowledgement of City Support
- Compliance with Copyright Law
- Compliance with the Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act and Employee/Volunteer Clearance Verification, if applicable
- Environmentally Preferable Procurement Policy

Insurance Requirements:

A Certificate of Insurance (COI) is required *before* we can process the contract. The COI must contain:

- Commercial General Liability: minimum \$1,000,000 per occurrence
- Auto: Either commercial policy or Non-Owned and Hired Insurance \$1,000,000 per occurrence
- Workers' Compensation: \$1,000,000 per occurrence + <u>waiver of</u> <u>subrogation</u>
 - If your org does not have employees you can sign a form attesting so the Workers Comp requirement can be waived Note: Please ensure you reflect any increase in cost for insurance in your budget
