

San José's *eleventh annual count* of trail users occurred on Wednesday, September 13 at six count stations.


The related survey results are published via the *Trail Count 2017 Summary Report*.

In general, we documented decreasing traffic, but in all instances, the drop was less than the substantial increases noted in 2016. The long-term trend line indicates increasing trail usage.

- Guadalupe River at Coleman Avenue: 1,269 in 2016, 996 in 2017; a 21.5% decrease. This station had recorded a 29.9% increase in 2016; a 1day special event is believed to have increased traffic that year.
- Guadalupe River at Riverpark Towers (New station): visited by 724 users.

- Guadalupe River at River
 Oaks Parkway: 2,325 in 2016,
 2,376 in 2017; a 2.2%
 increase.
- Los Gatos Creek at Hamilton Avenue: 1,380 in 2016, 1,135 in 2017; a 17.8% decrease. This station had recorded a 21% increase in 2016.
- Los Gatos Creek at Auzerais Avenue: 163 in 2016, 160 in 2017; a 1.8% decrease. AM and PM counts only.
- 7. **NEW:** On-Street Bike lanes; San Fernando Street, used by 136 from 7:00-9:00am and 173 from 4:00-7:00pm. Fourth Street used by 43 in morning and 69 in evening. Eighty-four skateboarders were counted along both routes during the evening count.
