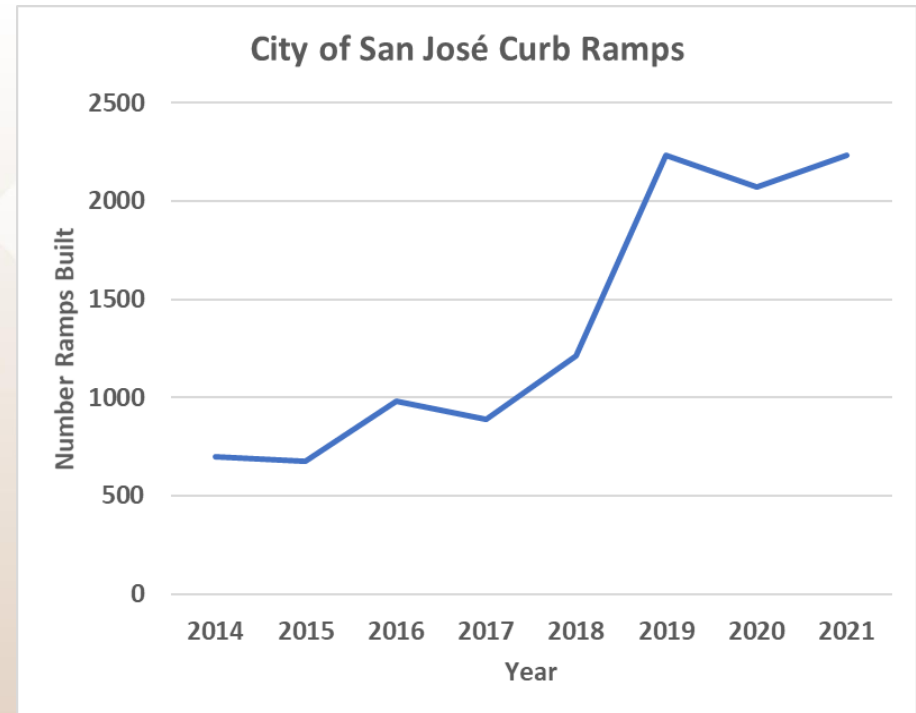
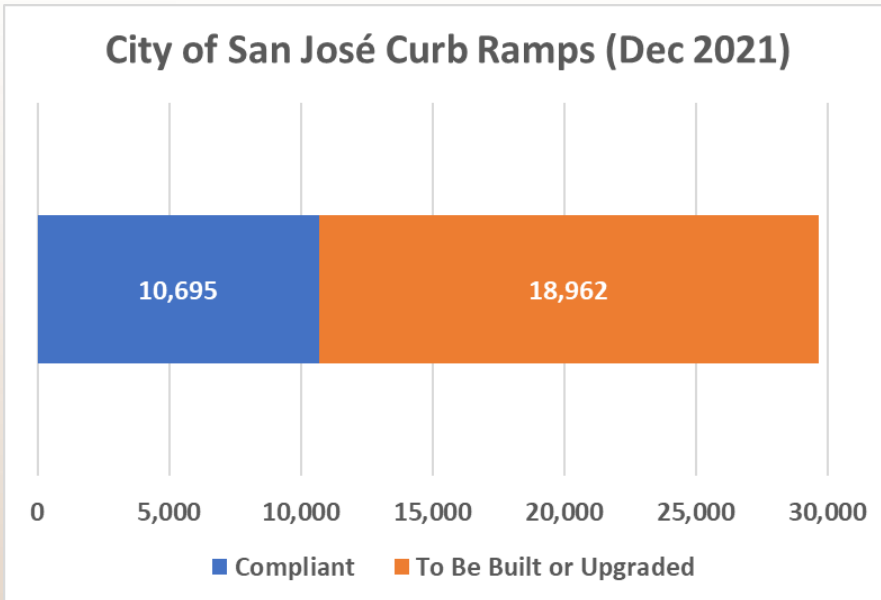

- Curb ramps requested by citizens

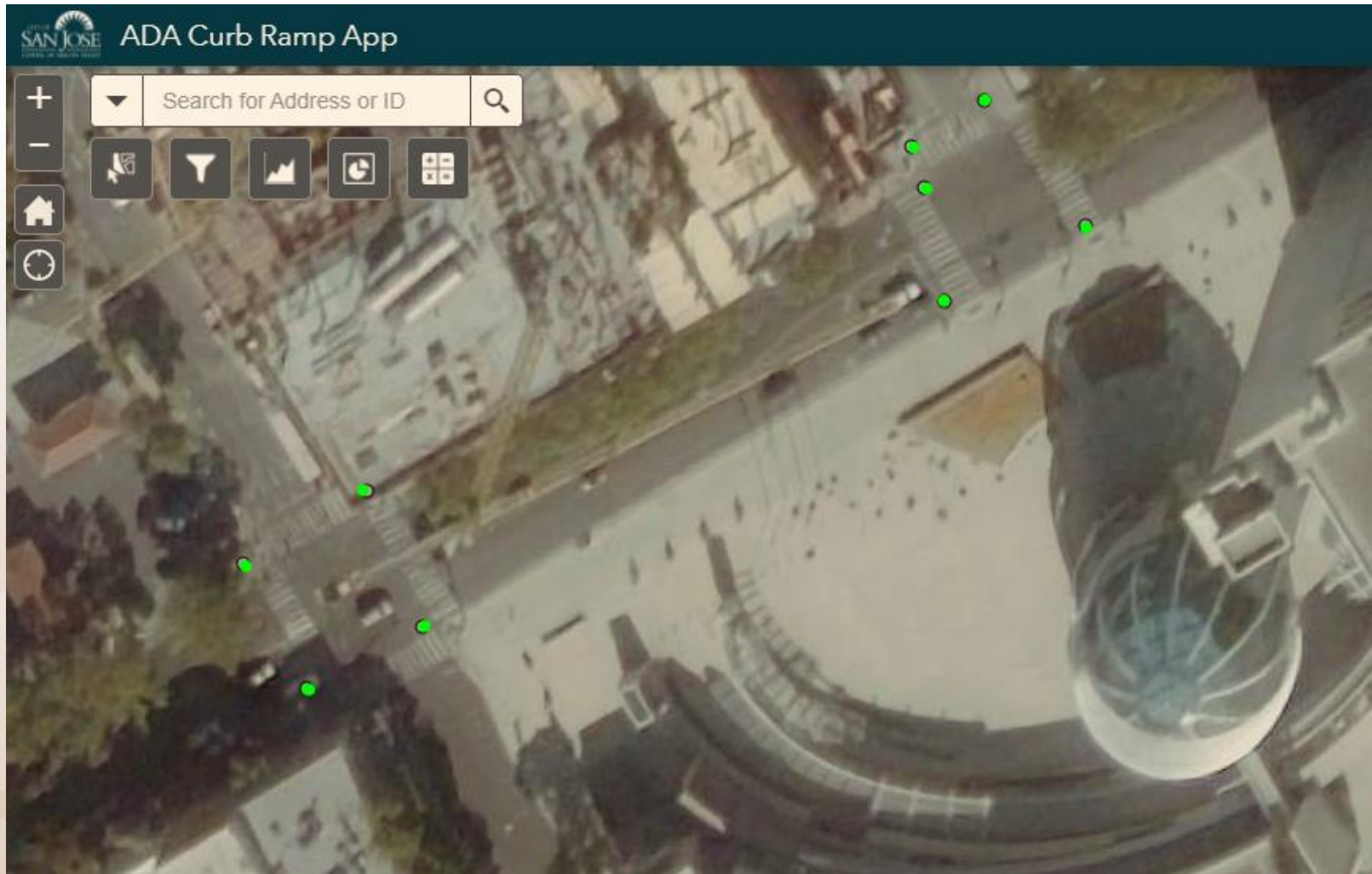

 - Updates Related Appendices

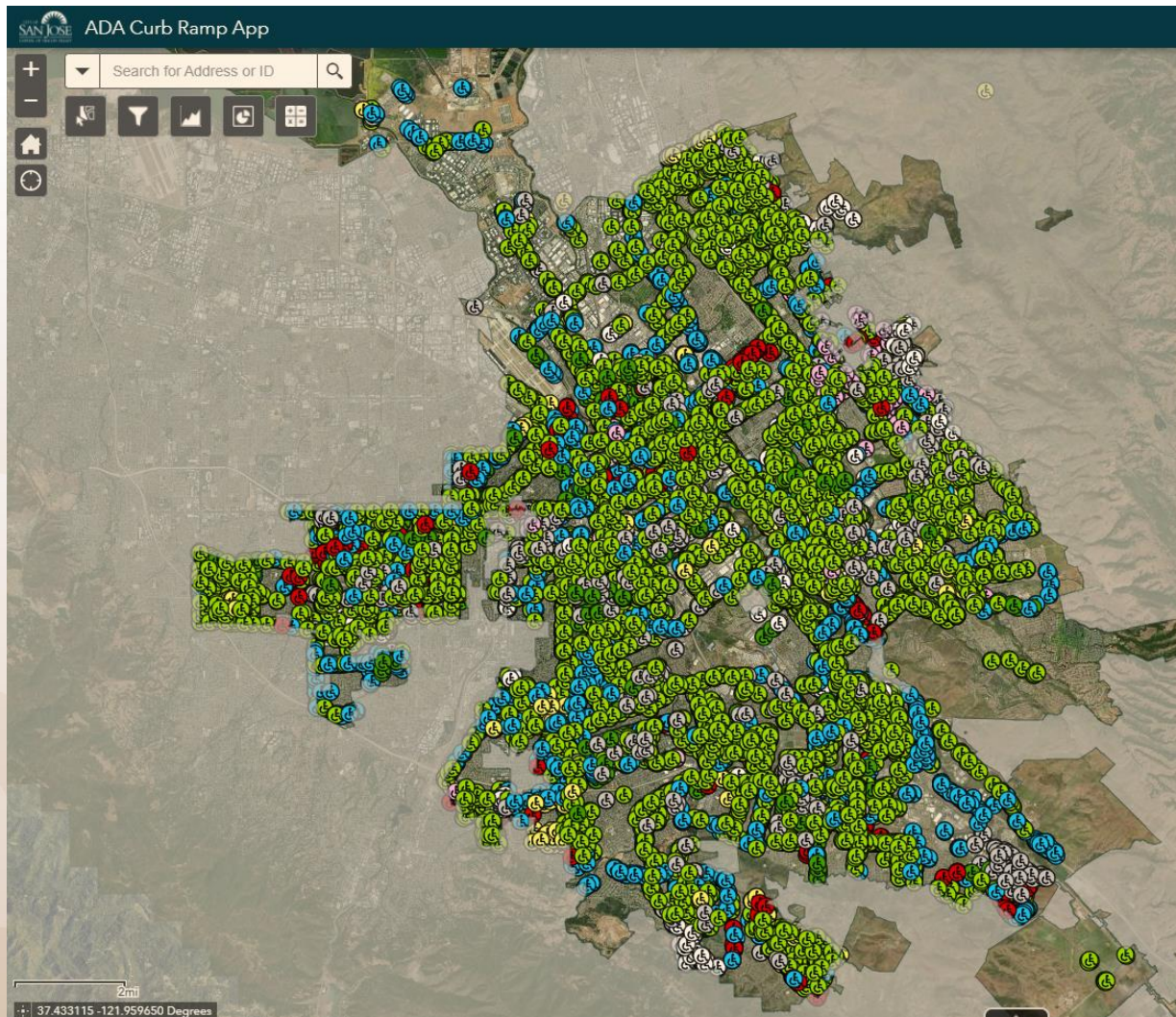
Amendment to the ADA Transition Plan

- City's recent ADA curb ramp inventory
 - 2017-2018: Surveyed and collected curb ramp data
 - Approximately 12,000 intersections and 29,700 curb ramp locations (existing and missing ramps)

- A schedule and plan for making all the City's curb ramps ADA-compliant

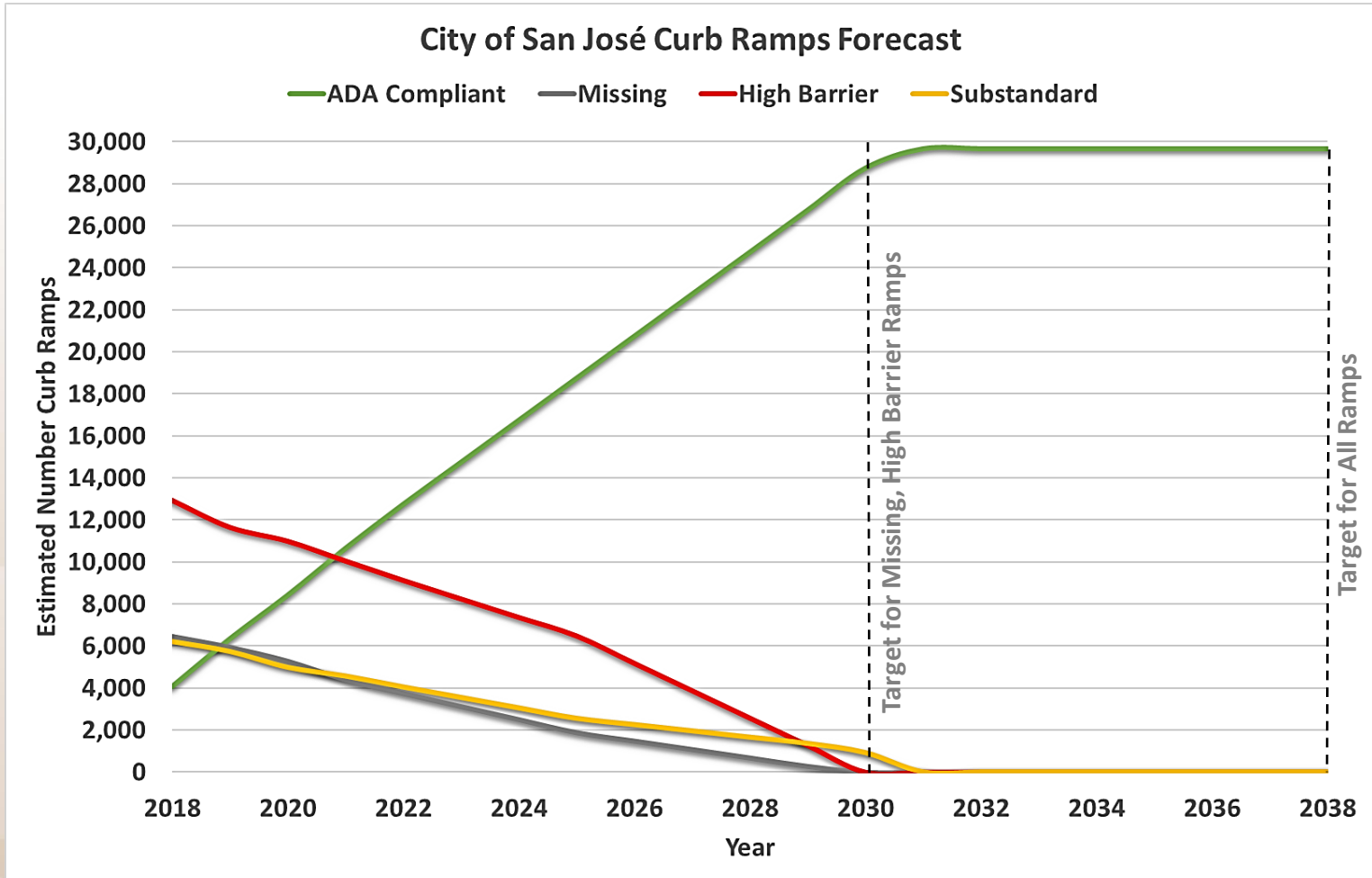

Amendment to the ADA Transition Plan

- City's curb ramp request program:
 - **Highest Priority (P*)** – Request Made by Citizen with a Disability
 - **Priority 1 (P1)** – City Government Offices and Facilities
 - **Priority 2 (P2)** – Transportation Corridors
 - **Priority 3 (P3)** – Hospitals, Medical Facilities, Assisted Living Facilities, and Other Similar Facilities
 - **Priority 4 (P4)** – Places of Public Accommodation Such as Commercial and Business Zones
 - **Priority 5 (P5)** – Facilities Containing Employers
 - **Priority 6 (P6)** – Residential
