**The City of San José is working with Garavaglia Architects, a historic architectural and planning firm, on an exciting new project:**

### **Five Wounds Urban Village Plan Update Historic Resources Survey**

**The project will be kicked off with the May 15<sup>th</sup> community meeting to:**

- introduce the project
- identify community members that would like to talk to City staff and/or Garavaglia Architects about people and events that are under-recognized in survey area; and
- identify buildings, objects, features, places, landscapes that represent the “untold” stories.

The historic survey is being coordinated with the current Five Wounds Urban Village Plan Update, which is a collaborative effort of the City of San José, Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority, and community. The survey effort implements the adopted San José City Council Historic Survey Strategy which directed staff to proactively identify historic resources and to update the San José Historic Resources Inventory to allow the City to preserve more historic structures.

### **What is a Historic Resource Survey?**

A historic resource survey is a planning tool for identifying, recording, and evaluating older buildings, features and places that help to tell the story of an important person, community or group, or exhibit significant architecture or landscape design. Historic resources are valuable aspects of a community that provide a sense of place and give a location its character.

### **What is the San José Historic Resources Inventory?**

The Historic Resources Inventory (HRI) is a resource document of identified and listed historic properties used for conducting review of planning entitlement requests. It is also used for the potential designation of City Landmarks and Historic Districts. The HRI contains more than 4,000 properties and is continually being updated as new properties are identified.
