RECOMMENDATION

Recommend that the City Council approve the proposed 40 FY 2023-24 *Festival, Parade, & Celebration (FPC)* Grant awards specified in Attachment A and subject to the availability of funds appropriated in the City's FY 2023-24 Operating Budget.

BACKGROUND

Through the Office of Cultural Affairs (OCA), the City of San José provides a limited number of *Festival, Parade, & Celebration Grant (FPC)* awards each year to expand access for all City residents to a wide range of cultural experiences in the form of community festivals, parades, and celebrations, large and small. These events are often held in public spaces and are always open to the entire public. Most FPC-supported events have free attendance, while some have fee-based admission to some parts of or the entire event. In a variety of ways, these festivals contribute to the San José's cultural enrichment, vibrancy, and economic prosperity, while helping to promote the city to visitors.

As noted in the FPC 2023-24 guidelines, funding is granted through a competitive process. Applications are assessed each year by a review panel for their responsiveness to the evaluation criteria published in the grant program guidelines.

ANALYSIS

The panel met on March 16 & 17, 2023 to complete its evaluation and was impressed by the overall quality and quantity of cultural offerings in San José.

The FPC Grant Review Panel is typically comprised of individuals experienced in special event production, community members familiar with special events in San José, and a representative from the Arts Commission.

The panel was comprised of the following members:

- **Richard Ajluni,** *Executive Director, JW House*
- **Jonathan Borca,** Commissioner, San José Arts Commission
- Valéria Miranda, Executive Director, Santa Cruz Art League, and Pajaro Valley Arts
- Alfonso Perez, President, Filipino American Arts Exposition

The panel evaluated each application against five criteria: event narrative & cultural, historical and/or neighborhood significance (30%); communications, marketing, outreach, and attendance (30%); financial and budgetary capabilities/leveraging of City funding (20%); ability to produce a well-planned, and safe event (10%); and economic impact (10%).

The panel did not have specific dollar amounts to recommend for distribution at the time of its meeting. Instead, the panel made recommendations for the percentage distribution of total FPC funds across the categories.

The OCA received 32 applications of which 30 were deemed eligible for the FY 2023-24 FPC Grants cycle. Applications were organized into four groups based on the most recent actual expenditures for events covered by grant applications. The combined value of eligible grant requests was \$801,660.

The panel recommended funding for 26 of the 30 eligible applications based on the ranking of their scores in each budget category. Due to the City's pending development of the proposed Operating Budget for FY 2023-24, the panel did not have specific dollar amounts to recommend at the time of its meeting. Instead, the panel made recommendations for approximate funding percentages, to be adjusted proportionally, when the final amount for distribution is available.

Of the 30 eligible FPC applications, 50% are BIPOC (Black Indigenous People of Color)-led organizations, 50% are BIPOC-serving organizations, and 47% are both BIPOC-led and BIPOC-serving organizations.

The OCA will offer technical assistance to applicants not recommended for funding. Offered assistance will include feedback from the review panel. Further assistance in the form time with a a nonprofit grant writing professional will be offered. It is the experience of the OCA Cultural Funding Portfolio team that organizations that take advantage of offered technical assistance benefit from the learning opportunity and tend to score higher in subsequent grant cycles.

Additionally, 14 FY 2022-23 FPC grantees who met the two-year eligibility to roll over their scores from the previous grant cycle are also included on the proposed list of FY 2023-24 FPC Grant Awards. With the panel recommended 26 applications, and the 14 two-year grantees, the total number of proposed FPC grant awards is 40.

PUBLIC OUTREACH

The Executive Committee reviewed these recommendations at a publicly noticed meeting on May 1, 2023. Notices of granting opportunities were distributed to the OCA's e-mail contacts lists, posted on the OCA website, uploaded on the City of San José WebGrants platform, and shared via social media.

ATTACHMENT B: FY 2023-2024 FPC Grant Recommendations Event Descriptions

Campus Community Association

Event: Bark in the Park

Grant will support Bark in the Park, an annual neighborhood dog-centric family event, held yearly for the last 22 years. It promotes Naglee Park and Downtown San Jose Living. Proceeds support various local non-profit organizations.

Children's Discovery Museum of San Jose

Event: Children's Cultural Festival Series

Grant will support the Children's Cultural Festival Series comprised of eight celebrations reflecting Latino, Vietnamese, Chinese, Indian, LGBTQ and African American families in our community. Held within Children's Discovery Museum, children and families are invited to learn about other cultures during these festivals through music, dance, arts activities, foods, and traditional clothing. Planned in collaboration with and supported by Community Advisory Committees or partner CBOs, the festival series will begin September 23, 2023 through June 19, 2024.

Chinese Performing Arts of America (CPAA)

Event: CPAA Spring Festival Silicon Valley

Grant will support CPAA's 15th Annual Spring Festival Silicon Valley (SFSV) scheduled for January -February 2024. SFSV is a colorful and vibrant multi-event festival that will entertain and engage over 9,000 residents in the South Bay during the Lunar New Year.

Chopsticks Alley Art

Event: Son Mai Art Making at Moon Festival 2023

Grant will support Chopsticks Alley Art's art-making booth at the 2023 Moon Festival to teach participants how to make Son Mai paintings. This art form was revived and developed as a distinct genre of fine art painting by Vietnamese artists in the 1930s. Participants will be taught how to use premade scratchboards to make a reinterpreted and accessible version of Son Mai paintings to teach Vietnamese Americans the richness of this cultural artistic tradition.

Christmas in the Park

Event: Christmas in the Park

Grant will support Christmas in the Park, a free holiday walk through event in Downtown San Jose. For over 40 years, this holiday festival has evolved to create lasting memories for the community and consists of more than 500 decorated trees, over 40 animated exhibits, live entertainment and so much more. The event is scheduled for November 24, 2023 - January 1, 2024.

Cinequest

Event: Cinequest Film Festival

Grant will support the annual Cinequest Film Festival during February through March 12, 2024, in San Jose. This annual film festival features over 260 local, national, and international premiere films, 700 film artists, interactive forums and more in its annual celebration of the creation and discovery of cinematic art and innovation plus the connection of artists, innovators, movie lovers and students.

Compasspoint Mentorship

Event: Dragon Boat Festival

Grant will support the Dragon Boat Festival, a one-day event at the picturesque waterfront of Alviso Marina County Park. The highlight of the day will be the dragon boat races taking place on the water. The festival will also offer a variety of entertainment options including traditional drumming and dancing performances, hands-on dragon boat making workshops, and a lively fashion show.

CURATUS

Event: South FIRST FRIDAYS' Summer Series: SubZERO Festival & STREET MRKT Grant to support SubZERO Festival and STREET MRKTs, urban street fairs full of artisans and live music lining South First Street in downtown San Jose's eclectic South of First Arts District (SoFA). Held in conjunction with South FIRST FRIDAYS' gallery walks on the first Friday of June, August, September, and October. SubZERO and the STREET MRKTs represent the funky side of the region's arts, entertainment, and cultural district

Ethiopian Community Services, Inc.

Event: Enkutatash, 11th Annual Ethiopian New Year Celebration

Grant will support 11th annual Ethiopian New Year's celebration Enkutatash, which will be held on Sunday, September 9, 2023, at Arena Green West in Downtown San José. The event is an important way for Ethiopian Community Services to support the cultural and emotional needs of the Ethiopian community and to promote understanding and appreciation of Ethiopian culture among the broader public. It aligns with the organization's mission and their goal of enhancing the quality of life for Ethiopians living in Santa Clara County.

Fountain Blues Foundation

Event: San Jose Fountain Blues Festival

Grant will support the 40th Annual San Jose Fountain Blues and Brews Festival which will take place June 2024 at Plaza de Cesar Chavez in Downtown San Jose. The festival will offer a diverse line-up of national and regional musicians, ranging in in genres from traditional roots blues, gospel and R&B, to funk, soul, rock, and swing - plus a "Blues Beyond" stage featuring young Artists blending multiple-popular music genres rooted in blues influences.

Subject: Proposed 2023-24 Festival, Parade & Celebration Grants

Gay Pride Celebration Committee

Event: SV Pride Parade and Festival

Grant will support the Silicon Valley PRIDE parade and festival on August 26 and 27, 2023 at Plaza de Cesar Chavez in Downtown San Jose. The event aims to raising the awareness and visibility of LGBTQ+ community members and allies in San Jose and Silicon Valley.

Guadalupe River Park Conservancy

Event: Pumpkins in the Park

Grant will support Pumpkins in the Park on October 7, 2023, in Discovery Meadow. It is a one-day festival celebrating the environment and harvest season that features entertainment, arts, and other hands-on activities. Pumpkins in the Park has been held since 1995 and is a family tradition for many in San Jose and beyond.

International Children Assistance Network (ICAN)

Event: Back to School Fest

Grant will support ICAN's Back to School Event to be held at the Vietnamese American Cultural Center. The event will bring together Latino, Vietnamese, and Filipino families who reside in East San Jose. More than 600 children and their family members are expected to attend. The event is to support the families of East San Jose and give children in East San Jose a fun experience before returning back to school.

Italian American Heritage Foundation

Event: Italian Family Festa

Grant will support the major outreach program of the Italian American Heritage Foundation (IAHF) which is the annual Italian Family Festa. The two-day community festa, now on its 41st year, will be held August 19 and 20 at History Park San Jose and is a family-focused celebration of heritage and community through cultural exhibits, entertainment, artisan booths, lectures and cuisine.

Local Color SJ (fiscal sponsor)

Event: Culture Night Market

Local Color is the 501(c)(3) Fiscal Sponsor of the Culture Night Market, a community gathering, and place where people can celebrate the distinct culture of San Jose through food, art, and music. The LatinX, Asian, Black and POC community, contributes a broad range of subcultures: This event is designed to empower small business, local entrepreneurs & artists by keeping the stream of income within our community. For the 2023-24 year, the Culture Night Market Proposes a series of 12 events beginning in July 2023.

Luna Park Arts Foundation

Event: Annual Luna Park Chalk Art Festival

Grant will support the return of the annual Luna Park Chalk Art Festival on September 16, 2023 at Backesto Park. Artists of all ages create colorful works of art on the pathways throughout the park. The event includes artists, musicians, food, and local vendors coming together with local school students and their families for a day of artistic celebration.

Subject: Proposed 2023-24 Festival, Parade & Celebration Grants

Mosaic America

Event: Mosaic Festival Silicon Valley

Grant will support Mosaic Festival Silicon Valley, a weekend festival in East San Jose featuring free performances in music, dance, visual art and spoken word by artists representative of the many diverse communities that live in the region and serving a projected audience of 3,000. The event is scheduled for August 26 and 27, 2023.

Nikkei Matsuri, Inc.

Event: Nikkei Matsuri

Grant will support the Nikkei Matsuri (Japanese American ["JA"] Festival, a celebration of the JA culture and heritage, located in the heart of San Jose Japantown. Through traditional Japanese and contemporary JA cuisine, arts and crafts, performing arts (music, dance, martial arts, taiko, etc), and cultural displays (ikebana, bonsai, sword, kimono, etc.), the festival's goals are to educate and foster appreciation/understanding about JA culture among greater San Jose community and beyond.

Positive Alternative Recreation Teambuilding Impact (PARTI) Program

Event: Youth Music and Arts Festival

Grant will support the Youth Music and Arts Cultural Festival which provides 25 youth artists and performers a grassroots platform where they can come together to share their culture and artistic expression through music and arts, while exploring new avenues for collaboration, action and celebration. The one-day event is youth built and youth led and will reach 2,500 virtual and in person participants.

Portuguese Heritage Society of CA

Event: 25th Annual Dia de Portugal Festival

Grant will support the 25th Annual Dia de Portugal Festival which will be held at History Park, in Kelley Park, on June 10, 2023, and expects to draw 4,500 participants. It is a fun-filled day of cultural entertainment, food, and education about the Portuguese, an important population in San Jose's history and ethnic mosaic.

Project MORE Foundation

Event: Jubilee Wellness Festival

Grant will support the Jubilee Wellness Festival on September 16-17, 2023, a free LGBTQ+ and Ally community health and wellness festival. This unique community event serves marginalized and disproportionally affected people in Santa Clara County. Jubilee is hosted annually on a Saturday to coinciding and celebrate National Gay Men's HIV/AIDS Awareness Day.

Rose, White and Blue Parade

Event: Rose, White & Blue 4th of July Parade

Grant will support the annual Rose White & Blue Parade and Festival on July 4, 2023, a historic community celebration that brings together residents, businesses and organizations of San José and the greater Bay Area in celebration of diversity, public spirit, and floral/agricultural heritage through an annual parade and festival.

San Jose Center for Poetry and Literature

Subject: Proposed 2023-24 Festival, Parade & Celebration Grants

Event: San Jose Poetry Festival

Grant will support the 8th Annual San José Poetry Festival which will be held September 8-10, 2023, featuring national and San José talent in readings and workshops, collaborative opportunities for writers and audience, and economic opportunities for local small presses.

San Jose Downtown Association (fiscal sponsor)

Event: Dia de San Jose

Grant will support Dia de los Muertos San Jose (Dia San Jose) on October 16, 2023, at Plaza de Cesar Chavez. Dia San Jose celebrates the Day of the Dead - a one-day family friendly event of Mexican, Spanish, Aztecs and other indigenous people that now cross cultures in San Jose.

San Jose Downtown Association

Event: Downtown Ice

Grant will provide support Downtown Ice – Downtown San Jose's iconic ice-skating rink averaging more than 50,000 skaters and 110,000 additional spectators annually. Downtown Ice will operate from November 17, 2023, through January 19, 2024, at the Circle of Palms Plaza, Downtown San Jose.

San Jose Downtown Association (fiscal sponsor)

Event: Music in the Park

Grant will support Music in the Park's three shows for FY 2023-24 at Plaza de Cesar Chavez. This has been San Jose's premiere after-work music series for 30-plus years, with performances by national musicians in a family-friendly setting. Dates: July 2023, August 2023, and an unscheduled date in June 2024.

San Jose Downtown Association

Event: SoFA Street Fair

Grant will support the SoFA Street Fair, the original family-friendly street festival for the South First Arts (SoFA) District, bringing together a diverse lineup of legendary San Jose and regional live bands for one day each Spring and Fall. The event is enhanced by local artisan craft booths, food trucks, street performers, participatory art and eclectic activities that showcase SoFA's vibrancy. Scheduled for September 2023 and April 2024.

San Jose State University Research Foundation

Event: International Mother Language Celebration

Grant will support the 5th annual Mother Language Day festival, an event that celebrates cultural diversity through dance, food, language, and art. The festival aims to showcase the diversity of San Jose, strengthen community bonds, and promote local businesses.

Subject: Proposed 2023-24 Festival, Parade & Celebration Grants

San Jose Jazz

Event: San Jose Jazz Summer Fest

Grant will support the South Bay's largest music festival in Downtown San Jose. Summer Fest features 90+ community-accessible shows in a wide variety of musical genres over three days in August 2023.

San Jose Multicultural Artists Guild

Event: Dia de los Muertos Festival and Celebration

Grant will support the SJMAG's 26th Anniversary Dia de los Muertos Celebration which will include a procession (comparsa) starting at the Cesar Chavez Park or Park View Plaza and ending at the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Library on the San Jose State University Campus. A four-hour free community celebration and closing of a month-long art exhibition of approximately 25 altars created by local artists and participating community members will take place.

School of Arts and Culture @ MHP

Event: Chile, Mole, Pozole

Grant will support Chile, Mole, Pozole (CMP) on Sunday, September 17, 2023, at the Mexican Heritage Plaza (La Plaza) in celebration of Mexican Independence Day, bridging the traditions of Mexico and East San José.

Sikh Guwarda - San Jose

Event: Hola Mohalla Festival

Grant will support the "Hola Mohalla Festival," an event held March 11, 2024, at the community asset called the San Jose Gurdwara.

Silicon Valley African Film Festival

Event: 14th Silicon Valley African Film Festival

Grant will support the 14th annual Silicon Valley African Film Festival (SVAFF), a showcase of over 80 films from about 30 African countries as well as performances, fashion show, arts and crafts, food, etc. The Cinema Cafe Series is SVAFF's year-round community engagement with virtual and in-person screenings in multiple San Jose locations.

Silicon Valley Jewish Film Festival

Event: Silicon Valley Jewish Film Festival

Grant will support the Silicon Valley Jewish Film Festival, October to November 2023. The festival screens films, including both documentaries, and features whose subject matter pertains, whether directly or indirectly, to Jewish culture, peoplehood, tradition, education, and history.

Silicon Valley Shakespeare

Event: Free Shakespeare in the Park 2024

Grant will support the 2024 Free Shakespeare-in-the-Park Festival held at Bramhall Park, in the Willow Glen neighborhood from June 3 - 17, 2024.

Subject: Proposed 2023-24 Festival, Parade & Celebration Grants

Veggielution

Event: San José VeggieFest

Grant will support San Jose VeggieFest, a free admission festival that attracts families from San Jose and the entire Bay Area region to come together to enjoy a day filled with multicultural live entertainment, delicious vegan food, and shopping from local small & micro businesses. This festival encourages tourism in the surrounding Downtown areas, helps small and micro businesses and encourages people to explore new cultures through art, music, dance, and food.

Vietnamese American Roundtable

Event: VAR's Black April Commemoration

Grant will support the 12th Annual Black April Commemoration which serves to honor the past and future goals of the Vietnamese American community since the Fall of Saigon over 45 years ago. Through multi-medium exhibits and performances, VAR seeks to evoke reflection upon the exodus of millions of Vietnamese boat people.

Executive Director, JW House
