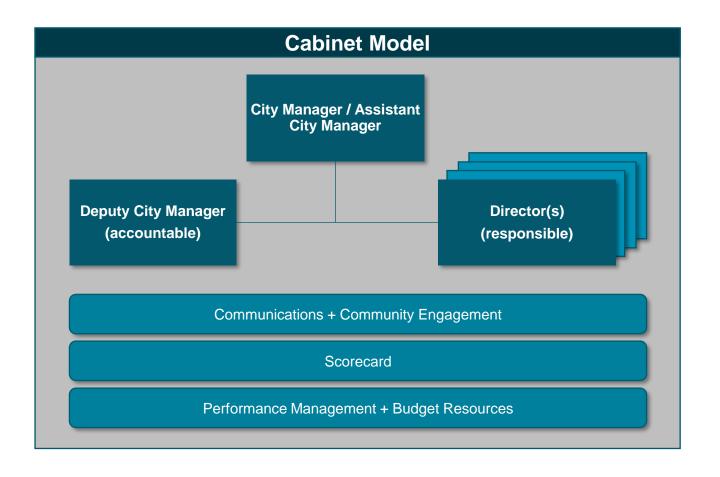
# **Execution as Learning**

# **Cabinet Details:**

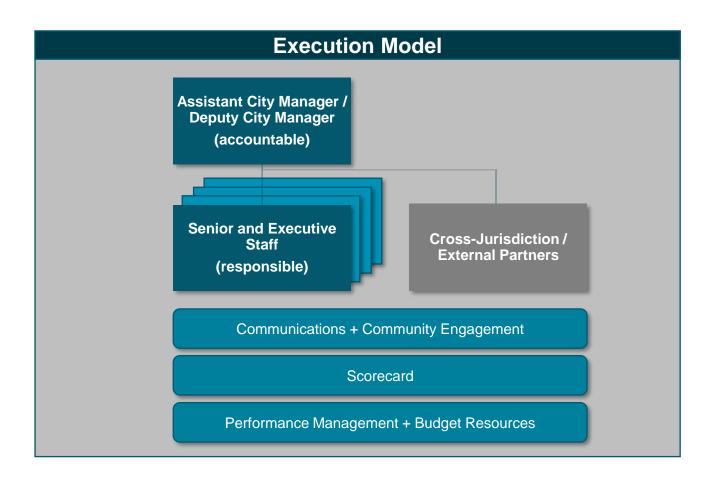
- Accountable for driving performance to achieve outcomes
- Rapid escalation and solution to issues by City Manager, Assistant City Manager, and accountable Deputy City Manager
- Enabling execution team success including creation of a safe space to experiment, fail, and quickly learn from failure
- Policy and trade-off decisions especially cross-department including resources, budget
- Monthly meeting cadence

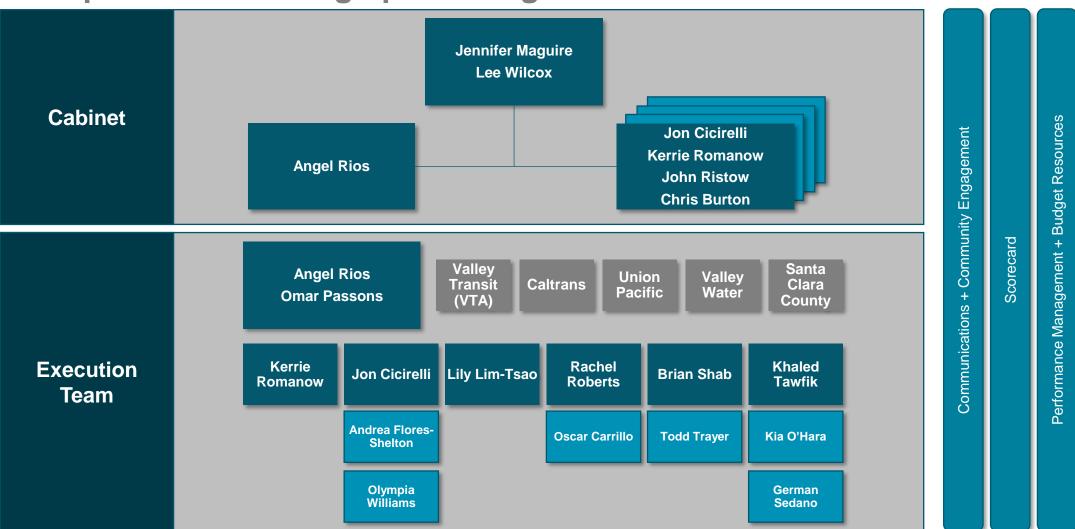
# **Execution Team Details:**

- Promote implementation and learning effectiveness and success
- Execution teams will utilize

- Frequent meetings (weekly, daily)

- 4. Decoupling a focused quarterly scorecard from a broader interactive dashboard

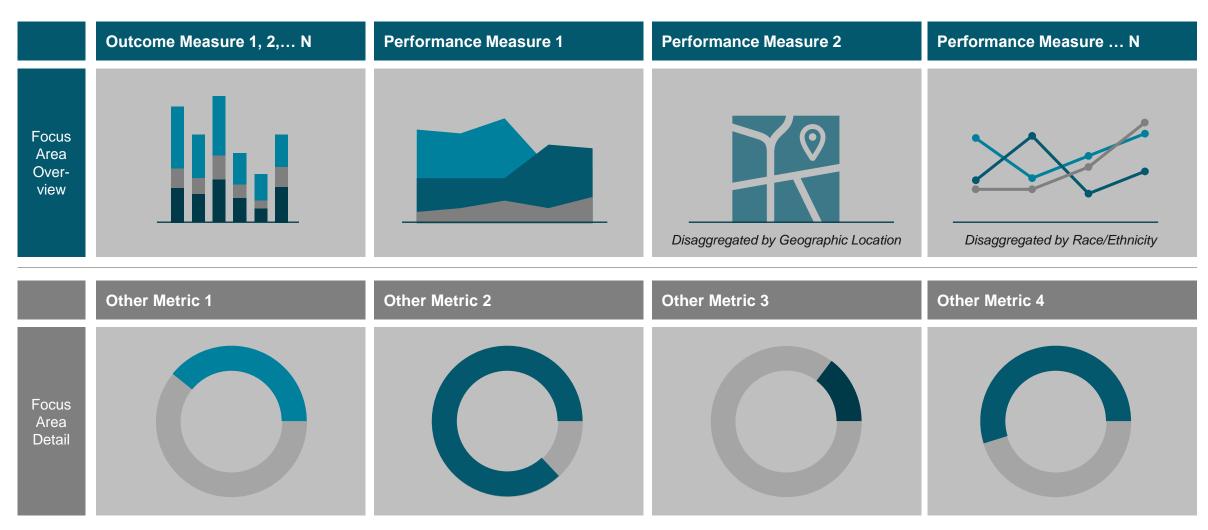

# **Next Steps**

- 1. Adopt the 2023-2024 budget
- Work with Departments and Information Technology to build Focus Areas scorecards and dashboards
- 3. Bring first quarterly update with scorecards to Council mid-October 2023
- 4. Include dashboards in subsequent updates to Council at the end of fall 2023
- 5. Increase the frequency and expand the scope of outcome and performance measure data collection to resolve reporting gaps
