




Why do outreach?

- Make sure all stakeholders and residents have the information they need to use and comply with the COPA program
- Increase community engagement efforts in most impacted communities
- Partner with industry stakeholders to ensure successful and efficient program
- Create enforcement rules that encourage participation and compliance

How to do outreach?

- ■Working with stakeholders to reach out to property owners and tenants
- ■Designing attractive and informative materials to increase awareness of the program
- ♠Ensure appropriate time for implementation
- Reaching out to historically underrepresented areas/groups

Potential Enforcement Principles

- Purpose of enforcement structure is to be educational, not punitive
- ▲ Like Housing Payment Equality Ordinance, COPA ordinance would allow Council to create a fee structure to incentivize program compliance
- ◆The fee structure would ramp up with subsequent violations, starting with notification/education for first offense.





Questions to Consider

- ▲ Legal implications of non-compliance: will COPA include legal recourse?
 - Plaintiff: Will the program be enforced by city staff or independent organizations bringing cases for redress, potentially in court?
 - Responsible Party: Who would be liable in that context: property owner, realtor, broker, etc.?
- Staffing Needs: how will COPA be managed and staffed at the City level? How will that staff time/positions be paid for?
- ▲ Limits of enforcement approach: since property sales are singular events, what is the proper enforcement approach to repeat offenders?
